The Task Force identified the focus areas of Supportive Housing, Medication Assisted Treatment, Community Education, Transportation and the replacement of the County mobile resource vehicle, Hope One and released an RLI in August of 2024. After analysis of the resulting letters of intent, the County released an RFP seeking projects related to these priorities in June 2025.

COT is also called out to responded to Opioid over doses and opioid emergency calls.

13	Please describe your public engagement/input efforts?	The COT has partnered with Hunterdon Prevention resources on Narcan presentations and distributions. COT regularly educates community members on what Narcan is and how it works. COT also discusses opioid use and misuse during home visit with community members who are currently using an opioid. COT follows up on all opioid ODs and emergency calls and offers case management services. COT also works with those in the community who have any type of addiction not just opioids. This year an educational presentation as well as Narcan distribution was held at a senior apartment complex. Opioid use and misuse along with how to use Narcan was presented at the Junior police Academy in July. In August Nation Night Out ensured Prevention Resources was on hand to distribute materials related to addictions. In September and another in October a Narcan distribution event will be held at an affordable housing complex. Currently we are in the process of organizing a drive thru Narcan distribution event. By the end of this year, we
