We strive to protect and serve by not only responding to incidents, but also proactively addressing issues that impact the long-term well-being of our residents. A key part of this mission is educating youth about the dangers of substance abuse and making investments that reduce risk in the future. During this reporting period, the police department purchased Fatal Vision Opioid Goggles to support our outreach in the high school. These tools allow students to experience the simulated impairments caused by opioid use in a safe and controlled setting, reinforcing the dangers of misuse in a way that lectures alone cannot achieve. By investing in prevention and education, we are aligning our spending decisions with our values of safeguarding youth, promoting healthy choices, and strengthening community resilience against the opioid crisis.

The decision to use opioid abatement funds for the purchase of Fatal Vision Opioid Goggles was guided by evidence-informed prevention strategies and our ongoing assessment of community needs. Our subdivision has seen the impact of opioid misuse on families, and we identified youth education as a critical area for prevention efforts. Research consistently shows that interactive and experiential learning methods are more effective at influencing decision-making in adolescents than passive instruction alone. The goggles provide a safe, hands-on tool that allows high school students to experience the simulated effects of opioid impairment, reinforcing the dangers of misuse in a memorable way. This initiative aligns with recommended opioid remediation uses focused on prevention and education, while also supporting our subdivision's strategic priority of reducing future substance abuse through early intervention.
