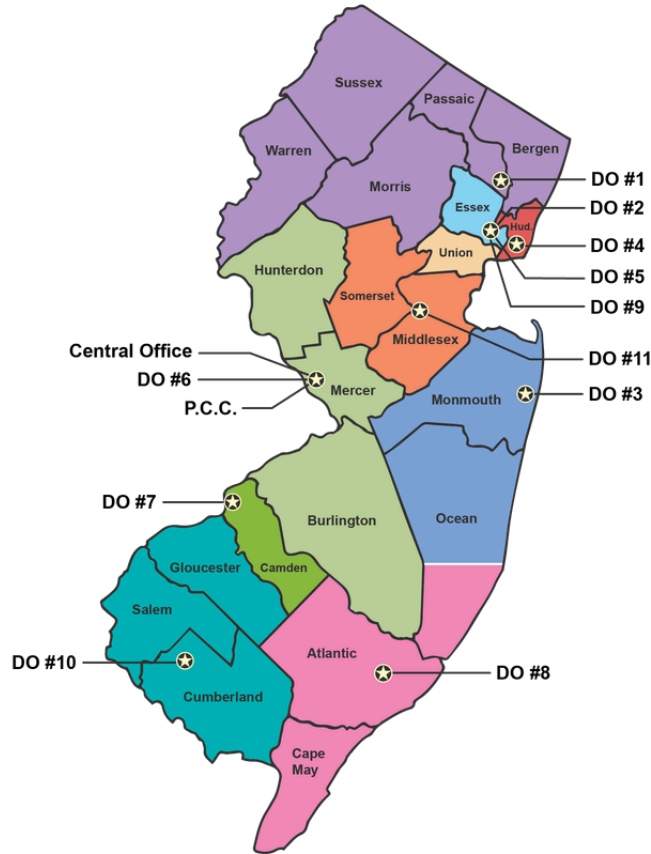

## TO BE CONSIDERED FOR AN INTERNSHIP, APPLICANTS MUST:

- Be a current, full-time college student (undergraduate or graduate level) with a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Be 18 years of age or older.
- Be a U.S. citizen.
- Complete and submit the application packet.
- Read and understand the rules and responsibilities of the New Jersey State Parole Board Internship Program.
- Complete a criminal history background verification.
- Be available to complete a minimum of 100 hours during the internship period.
