U.S. TO RECOGNIZE AND HONOR THE CRITICAL WORK OF PAROLE, PROBATION, AND PRETRIAL PROFESSIONALS

TRENTON, NJ, July 13, 2021—During the week of July 18th through the 24th, 2021, the essential responsibilities performed by probation, parole, and community supervision professionals will be honored nationwide during *Pretrial, Probation, and Parole Supervision Week*.

The mission of the New Jersey State Parole Board is to encourage public safety and assist offenders seeking to re-assimilate into society through the implementation of policies that result in effective parole case management.

Today in America, there are over five million adults on community supervision, and most of these individuals are monitored by pretrial, probation, and parole officers. The parole officer also works to help the offender achieve success by attending counseling sessions as well as helping them find suitable housing and employment.
