Commission Cases

The employer has appealed the Commission's decision in <u>Somerset Cty. Sheriff's Office</u> and <u>Somerset Cty. Sheriff FOP, Lodge No. 39</u>, P.E.R.C. No. 2007-33, <u>NJPER</u> (¶______ 2006), App. Div. Dkt. No. A-1899-06T3. The Commission affirmed an interest arbitration award. The Chairman denied the employer's request for a stay pending appeal.

An appeal has been filed in <u>Berkeley Tp. and Berkeley Tp. Police SOA</u>, P.E.R.C. No. 2007-25, <u>NJPER</u> (¶ 2006). The Commission held that <u>N.J.A.C</u>. 17:9-5.3(b) preempted negotiations over the Township's proposal to include premium sharing for dependent coverage of health insurance provided through the State Health Benefits Program.

An appeal has been filed in <u>City of Newark and Service Employees Int. Union, Local 617</u>, P.E.R.C. No. 2007-24, <u>NJPER</u> (¶ 2006). The Commission declined to restrain arbitration over a grievance contesting the employer's decisions to end a provisional employee's longevity payments and to seek to recoup previous payments.

Other Cases

In <u>In re Referendum Petition to Repeal Ordinance 04-75</u>, 388 <u>N.J. Super</u>. 405 (App. Div. 2006), the Court held that an ordinance reorganizing the police department of the City of Trenton was subject to approval or disapproval by referendum. The ordinance created a table of organization eliminating the position of deputy chief and also specified lines of authority and set the number of officers within each rank. The ordinance was considered a legislative act under the Faulkner Act rather than an executive or administrative act and was thus subject to citizen review.
