The 99th anniversary of the creation of the National Parks Service was commemorated with a collaborative volunteer effort. The Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission (PVSC) in conjunction with the National Park Service, the City of Paterson, the New Jersey Community Development Corporation (NJCDC), Eagle Creek Renewable Energy, local groups and community volunteers successfully completed the cleanup project as part of the maintenance effort around the Paterson Great Falls and its historical park.
