





















in celebration of Climate Week, the White House is announcing that more than 15,000 young Americans have been put to work in high-quality, good-paying clean energy and climate resilience workforce training and service opportunities through the American Climate Corps – putting the program on track to reach President Biden's goal of 20,000 members in the program's first year ahead of schedule.





NJ AmeriCorps is announcing a comprehensive approach toward climate and environmental stewardship in the nation's most densely populated state. Our five programs represent conservation initiatives throughout the state, in urban, suburban, and rural areas. We are specifically addressing city beautification, food rescue, watershed protection, arborist training, energy efficiency, and community and student education. As part of the national AmeriCorps development of climate response and resiliency, our AmeriCorps members will have access to special training and career development opportunities. Programs will also be encouraged to post their recruitment information on the national Climate Corps portal.

Free Mental Health and Wellness Support for **New Jersey College Students**









How New Jersey is Leading the Way to Address Student Mental Health

First-in-the-Nation Statewide Partnership

Data as of February 12, 2024

New Jersey was the first state in the nation to launch a statewide teletherapy platform designed to offer students access to digital mental health and wellness support.


The partnership provides more than 500,000 students at 44 public and private institutions with 24/7/365 access to free mental health supports, including:

Immediate appointment with a licensed

Direct crisis connection

On-demand wellness - yoga, meditation, mindfulness & more

Bridging the Gap: 24/7/365 Access to Mental Health Support for New Jersey Students



61% of New Jersey students who registered on the Uwill platform had not previously had an appointment with a therapist or mental health counselor at their institution*

79% of participating New Jersey college administrators agreed the partnership with Uwill has enabled them to provide or enhance mental health support to students after hours**

76% agree the partnership has expanded the diversity of providers available to students**

Roughly 33% of the appointments were made between 5 p.m. and 9 a.m. or on weekends, when many physical campus counseling centers are closed 66

With the Uwill partnership, students' mental health needs are being met at a much higher level than in the previous years.

Uwill counselors undergo DE&I training, demonstrate cultural competency, and follow strict FERPA and HIPAA compliance.

100% fully licensed, including crisis support

11 languages spoken 40% BIPOC 25% LGBQTIA+ 12 years clinical experience on average 50 states and international coverage

More than 50% of NJ students seek support from a BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and people of color) therapist.

Approximately 10% of NJ students seek support in languages other than English.
