

Marty Truscott from T&M Associates welcomed everyone to the 4<sup>th</sup> workshop meeting and said Deputy Mayor Lichtenstein was running late. He also said Stan Slachetka was unable to make the meeting because of because his daughter is graduating from high school. Mr. Truscott wanted to go directly to the breakout sessions but someone from the audience suggested they give a synopsis since this group is larger than other sessions he reviewed what was discussed at the three prior workshops and said this will be incorporated into a plan that will be submitted to the State. He spoke about the Plan Endorsement Process and the Smart Growth and the Township's vision is in integrating the Smart Growth and overall planning policy for the community. The first vision meeting talked about downtown parking and circulation, the BMG and GCU campus, downtown land use and affordable housing, the second meeting discussed Cedar Bridge Redevelopment, Franklin Street Redevelopment and downtown and the industrial parks and UEZ and the third vision meeting discussed the balancing of growth and preservation. Those comments and suggestions were written on the exhibit boards and those summaries will go to the office of Smart Growth. Minutes are also being prepared and are being sent as well.

Mr. Truscott said the three break out groups for this meeting were:

- Transportation Issue - facilitated by John Jennings
- Open Space Preservation – facilitated by Eric Nathanson and Marty Truscott
- Desired Forms of Development – facilitated by Robert Dare and Paul Ricci

Mr. Jennings has prepared a parking study for the downtown area and has assisted the township with a bus route service and he will be talking about circulations issues within the township.

Mr. Nathanson is an environmental scientist and is knowledgeable in wetlands, Category One and environmental issues and they will be talking about open space preservation.

Mr. Dare and Mr. Ricci and they will listen to and take comments on what you want from Lakewood, what types of development, not just residential. Tell them what you would like to see in Lakewood and what you think is good development.

## **Workshops**

Mr. Truscott opened the microphone up to the floor before they separated into the break out sessions for basic questions but suggested they wait for any specific questions for the break out sessions.

Earl Schwalji spoke and said he heard the word interchange used several times. He came to this meeting catching a 5 o'clock bus for a 6 o'clock meeting which didn't start until 6:30 and it is now 6:35 and there has not been much of an interchange because now they hear they will have to sit in and have other people talk to them. He said the people here have concerns and none of them have had the opportunity to express them directly, there is no mayor here, there is no deputy mayor here, there are only experts here who will push their perspectives on community growth and the majority of them here are not interested in having people tell us how wonderful Lakewood will be and he is skeptical about his being here and put in a weak, careless position and he doesn't think the audience has been given due respect or the opportunity to voice opinions without being talked to by people we know are going to be pushing for a community we don't want.

Mr. Truscott said let us wait for the break out session to see what is discussed.

Moshe Mueller said he has come to the previous meetings and people came out and there were a good exchange of ideas and people were courteous and if people went to the break out sessions with an open mind it could be very helpful.

Janet Scher said she served on the Master Plan advisory committee and it is very disturbing to her that these visioning meetings should have taken place at the beginning of the Master Plan advisory process not tacked on the end because it wasn't handled properly. None of those meetings were advertised to the public and if the public showed up they were asked to leave and it is important to have that on record.

Mr. Truscott said it was time to break off into the sections and he would take one more person from the audience.

Maria Sherman from Original Leisure Village. She said this is the first time she has heard about these meeting. She said they want the township to be respectful of the community's character and increasing the density, value the open space, compound the volume of traffic, creating more air pollution and depleting our trees and polluting the waters are some of the problems they face. The current traffic congestions at New Hampshire and Route 70, Route 9, etc. can someone tell them if there are any plans to build another interchange in Lakewood on the Parkway, and what about the bus station, are there any plans to improve the conditions there. Most of the people here go to Toms

River bus station, not Lakewood. They take the train from Pt. Pleasant or Bay Head. The increase in impervious coverage is also an important factor in the density issue in Lakewood and it has an impact on the water supply because of quality and quantity. Higher density, heavy rains + increased impervious coverage means flooding. She does not want her town to be like the towns in New Jersey that now get flooded out because of over development and the need now for flood insurance and other higher insurances.

The audience split up into the break out sessions.

Meir Lichtenstein addressed the audience and apologized for being late. He also said this is the fourth meeting and final one in this series.

Marty Truscott talked about his group discussion about Open Space Preservation. He said the talked about the Crystal Lake Preserve and how it is zoned for development but should be protected and it should be changed. There were also suggestions about the township acquiring property. Aquifer concerns were discussed because of the stormwater runoffs from developments. There was talk about the need for pocket parks in the densely developed areas more active recreation pathways to connect the parks and taxes generated for parks. There should also be a limited degree of development so that the impervious coverage does not impact the surface water. The DA1 designation is off the table at this time. There was a spirited discussion of the tree vegetation removal and protection of trees and if there needed to be a more stringent plan. More vegetative buffers need to be provided between developments and someone also suggested the use of reservoirs for water consumption, storage and use to be located by Cross Street and Prospect Street. Smart Growth looks for a balance between preservation and development and that is what they are looking for. Passive and active recreation and to maintain the difference between the two. Another suggestion was to petition Ocean County Land Trust to purchase open space and maintain current mapping and aerial photos to include new development and also to include a Tree Save Ordinance.

John Jennings spoke about the discussion group on transportation. He said there is a need for balance between properties. There is congestion on Route 9 and the State has said there is no possibility of 4 lanes but they will work with the community to come up with some design solutions for some parts of the roadways to be 3 lanes with turning lanes encouraging cut out for buses so they don't interfere with the flow of traffic, etc. It was suggested that in the downtown area limiting left turn at some of the cross street and Route 9 and left turn signals at traffic signals to provide better turning opportunities. Route 88 and Route 70 are also congested and Route 88 was discussed in previous meetings as a redevelopment area and there was talk of potential planning possibilities in that area and possible eminent domain as one issue of last resort. There was discussion on the east west connection and the north south connection; extending New Hampshire Avenue so you would not have to go onto Ridge or Joe Parker to County Line Road and also the Vine Street and Oak Street connection from Route 70 to Route 88 which would relieve a lot of the congestion from Route 9. There was also discussion on the downtown congestion and the alternatives such as a bus system and traffic flow. They will be loosing some parking spaces for the bus stops but the buses will serve all the

communities; they had heard that most of the senior communities had bus services but the suggestion is that if any buses are going by the senior community they will make the effort to stop at that senior community and that there be some coordination between the senior communities and the shuttle services. The purpose is to remove the traffic from the roadways and provide alternative means of transportation for all. The buses will hold 25 passengers and will be able to maneuver most streets. Another suggestion was to have a moratorium on building but there are legal issues involved and the only legal moratorium allowed is water. There is parking plans in development for deck parking in the downtown. It will accommodate approximately 500 spaces and Lakewood Development Corporation is looking to purchase small parcels for this project in coordination with the transit service and shuttle service would be available for people to take them to their cars while the deck is being built. MOM Study was talked about and the future of the train system, developments need to be more sensitive to buffering when development is done along rail right of way even though the time frame is far away (approximately 2018) and proper buffering needs to be done. There was also discussion on improvements to the bus terminal and to work with Lakewood on having 24 hour security. Another suggestion was getting another interchange along the GSP

Paul Ricci discussed the desired forms of development. They made a list of the dislikes:

- long blocks without sidewalks; Concern about the safety of the children
- Not enough affordable housing Lakewood actually meets stated COAH. There was also concern for workforce housing. Development wants- noise and people. There was concern about preserving but also the need to development deteriorated properties first before vacant land and there was strong discussion to promote growth where there was existing development. There was a comment about randomness and development in land use in houses with access to Route 9 and the thought was it was haphazard with the access onto Route 9 and there should be a reduction in driveway openings and curb cuts and encourage lateral openings onto Route 9. There was another comment about tax abatements and not to offer them in the Route 9 area. There should also be greater focus on design standards- greater quality and workmanship and also encourage more mixed use throughout the community especially the downtown area. There were several applications that were approved by planning and zoning boards that are waiting for the township to receive the regional center designation in order to be developed which is based on the impervious surface coverage allowed.

Another comment made was to maximize the potential of the industrial park. Another comment was the lack of common open space and there was also talk about the old Agway property and how it is overly dense with too much impervious coverage with a lack of open space and no backyards. There were comments about neo traditional developments but in Lakewood it may not be the best thing because Lakewood is already developed. It would be more suited for a town like Jackson, where the schools could also be evaluated at the same time. The main concern was that development was occurring too quickly and there needed to be a more growth management approach. Redevelop already developed, impoverish property first before you go to the vacant land. There was also a safety concern and the perception of safety. People needed to feel comfortable in the downtown area before they will use the downtown area. The last comment made was the current zoning be respected and not deviated.

Pat Weber had a question and asked what smart growth is going to do for her because as she sees it right now all it is going to do is increase her taxes, increase air pollution, increase water pollution, and increase pollution in general. She said right now the air quality in Lakewood is a 10 on a scale of 1 to 100 and most of the US is a 71. She said there are presently 45 private schools in Lakewood with the town looking to build another 16 schools on approximately 3-4 acres each. More than 3 out of every 5 acres in Lakewood Township is already developed, 61% the remaining 39% is undeveloped but is unusable for anything except open space and recreation because of environmental constraints such as wetlands etc. so she guesses the town would look at land already developed, such as the industrial park. She said every time a private school opens where a factory once stood, it has taken that parcel of land off the tax rolls and she said the senior community of Lakewood cannot afford to continue to pay for all these schools.

Mr. Ricci said he is not the one to answer her question but the reason he is here is to come up with a plan that is supported by the community for smart growth and does not know if it will benefit her.

Chaya Bender spoke and said she feels she does not want development to stop. She was born here and she wants to raise her children here and wants her children to live here with their children.

Someone from the audience who did not come up to a microphone said they thought the facilitator said they wanted a regional center but she said she did not think that was true and that most people in the audience did not want one. A show of hands showed that a regional center was inappropriate

Ralph Zucker said he was also at the same group as the people here and said as far as there being a majority of people being represented here and as far as a moratorium, it was far from a consensus, there are many people who do not want one. There is going to be growth anyway and that growth should be properly managed and properly developed so we have great places rather than what we have been having. Growth cannot be stopped.

Mr. Ricci reiterated he did not indicate they received a consensus on a moratorium but he did state he had an ethical obligation to state a moratorium could not be put into place unless there was a public health concern.

Mr. Truscott concluded the session with the statement that it was a good dialogue and discussion and announced there would be a public session on July 23<sup>rd</sup> @ 7:00 p.m. in Town Hall. He thanked everyone for their comments and participation.

The meeting ended at 8:45 pm
