Burlington	12,949.00	The Alice Paul Institute is seeking capital funding for Paulsdale, the birthplace and family home of New Jersey's most famous Quaker suffragist, Alice Paul (1885-1995) Funding from the NJ Cultural Trust will support the treatment (repair and refinishing) of Paulsdale's interior flooring and two staircases.	Capital Preservation - The grant will help fund the repair and refinishing of original wood floors and stairs throughout the building.
The National Society of The Colonial Dames of America In The State of NJ (NSCDA-NJ)	Burlington	50,000.00	The project will restore Peachfield's north terrace to allow for barrier-free access to the building as set out in the 2006 Vision Plan, a master plan funded by The New Jersey Historic Trust	Capital Preservation - The grant will help fund the repair of the stone terrace, construction of an accessible ramp and improvements to make the first floor of the house fully accessible.
The Ritz Theatre Company, Inc.	Camden	50,000.00	The Ritz Theatre Company strives to offer quality theatre in a safe, historically accurate facility. The current condition of our doors is deteriorating and unsafe to the security of the building. Requesting funds will be used to restore our exterior doors and hardware while keeping them historically accurate to 1927.	Capital Preservation - The grant will help fund the in-kind replacement of the deteriorated exterior doors.
Cape May Stage	Cape May	50,000.00	Grant Funding requested from the Cultural Trust's Preservation Program will be used towards labor and material for full restoration of the theater's interior ceiling and walls as part of the organization's overall facility restoration and renovation, Project Encore.	Capital Preservation - The grant will help fund the interior restoration of the ceiling, walls, and floor. The theater hosts numerous theatrical productions and educational activities throughout the year.
Bayshore Discovery Project	Cumberland	50,000.00	This project is a stand alone piece of the much more comprehensive restoration of the Bivalve Shipping Sheds and Wharves creating a tourist destination, museum and educational resource center. A restored 1916 railroad boxcar, much like those used during the height of the oyster industry, will be transformed into a handicapped accessible comfort station outfitted with composting toilets.	Capital Preservation - The grant will help fund the rehabilitation of a 1916 boxcar into a barrier-free restroom facility. The site is open to visitors.
Millville Army Air Field Museum	Cumberland	50,000.00	This project will replace an existing roof on Building 1 which is the Millville Army Air Field Museum's main headquarters. Building 1's historical significance is one of the original World War II facilities which houses the museum's exhibits, collections, offices, and visitor facilities.	Capital Preservation - The grant will help fund a historically accurate roof replacement for the site's main exhibit building.
Red Mill Museum Village	Hunterdon	50,000.00	To replace the cedar shingle roof of the Red Mill with new cedar shingles.	Capital Preservation - The grant will help fund the replacement of the cedar shingle roof.
American Labor Museum/Botto House National Landmark	Passaic	49,997.00	The Botto House National Landmark will undergo interior and exterior restoration and repairs, for the purpose of preservation and prevention of unsafe conditions. This project will be complete in time for the 100th anniversary celebration of the landmark in June 2008.	Capital Preservation - The grant will assist with resource improvements, including wood and plaster repairs, installation of egress signs, and restoration of garden structures.

The Meadows Foundation, Inc.	Somerset	50,000.00	Two of our historic houses do not have handicapped access entrance/exits. It has been a problem at all our historic houses. The major obstacle has always been lack of funds. It is not restoration. It is new construction. Plans have been completed for the Van Liew-Suydam House but plans have to be prepared for the Hagerman Farm House.	Capital Preservation - The grant will help fund accessibility improvements to both houses that are open to the public for tours and special events.
Reeves-Reed Arboretum	Union	50,000.00	The Reeves-Reed Arboretum proposes a stabilization project that will make improvements and repairs to key structural features that are critical in providing safe public access to the property. Special considerations must be considered since all work must be consistent with preserving the integrity of the historic landscape design.	Capital Preservation - The grant will help fund safety and accessibility improvements to the house and grounds that are open to the public.
Help our Preservation Effort	Warren	50,000.00	Help Our Preservation Effort's "Long House", built in 5 phases c. 1777 to c. 1870, is the only Hope building showing the community's development over 100 years. This project will rebuild the single story addition on the rear of the 1850 unit and remove and reconstruct the late 1700's Summer Kitchen Roof.	Capital Preservation - The grant will help fund rehabilitation and repair work in specific areas of the building.
