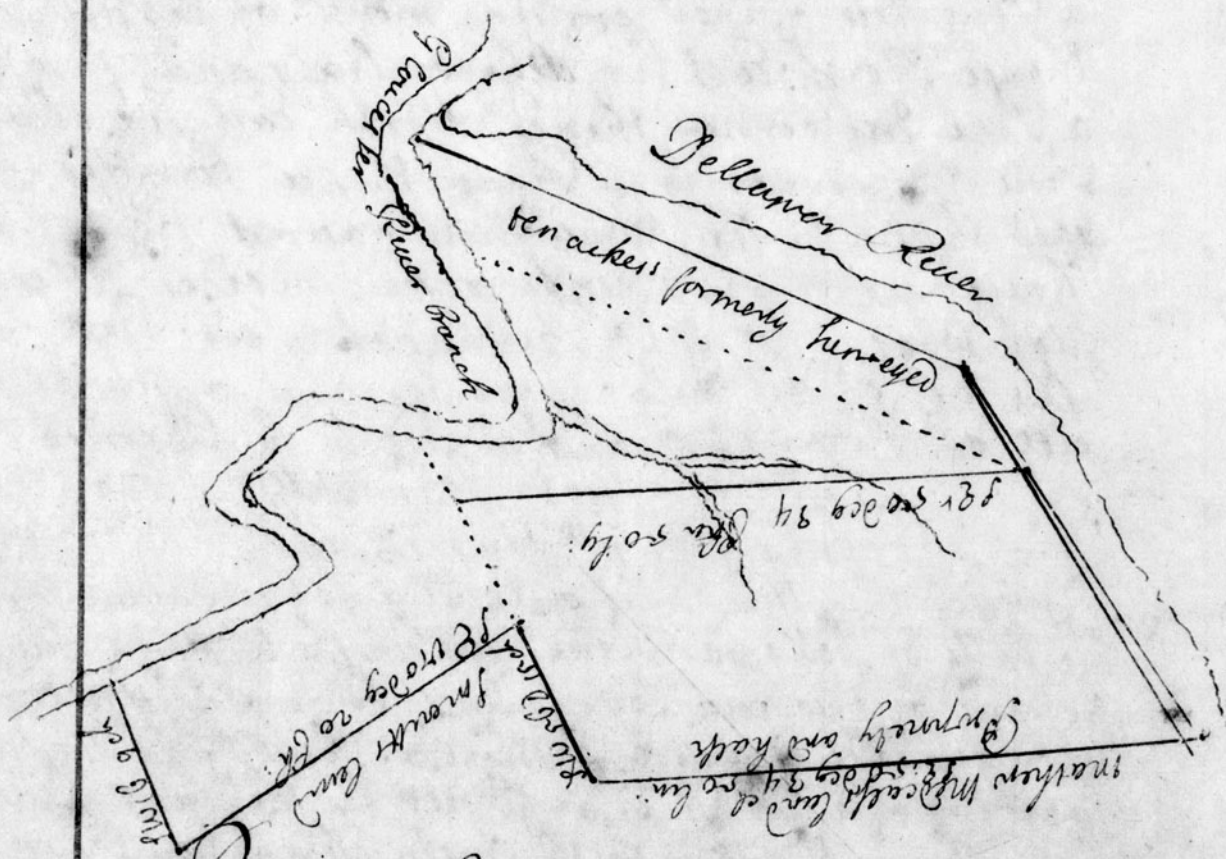

the Swamp.

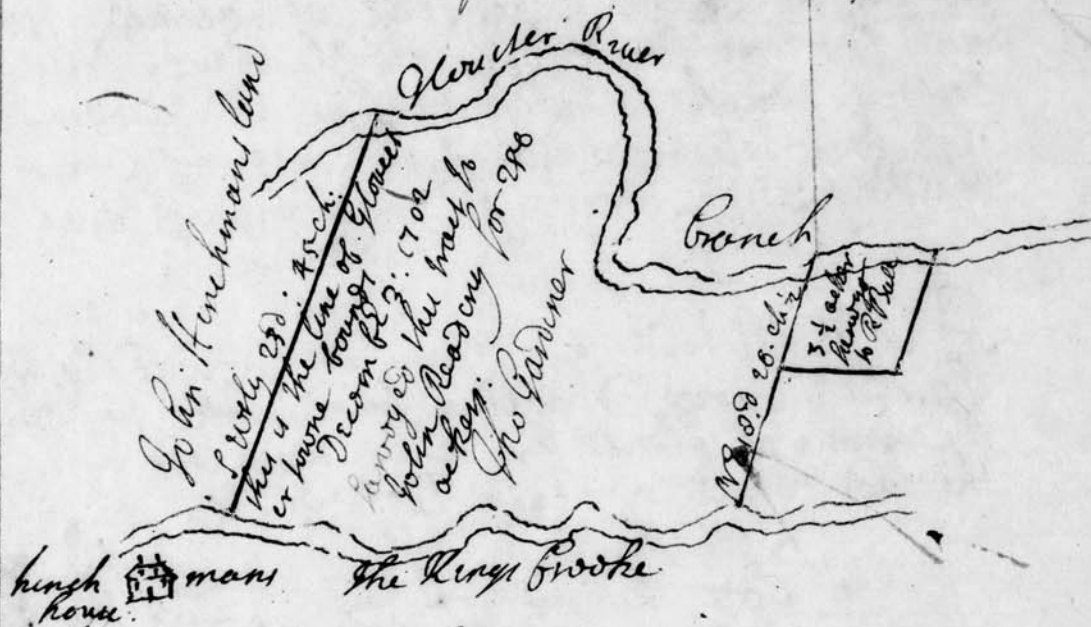
