in the County of Middlesex and in the Province of East New Jersey gave and
conveyed and hereafter convey a marriage formerly had and solemnized
in the Island of Barbados between the said John Berry and the said Thomas
Berry and one Margaret Blow daughter of the parish of St. Nicholas
in the Island aforesaid on or about the tenth day of October in the year of
our Lord one thousand six hundred seventy and three now know ye
that the said Thomas Berry as well for his good loves and
mighty considerations as for his moving as also at the special
instance and request of the said Margaret Berry and so by these
presents acquit release discharge and discharge the said Margaret Berry
of and from the said Bonds bys and obligations of marriage made as aforesaid
as much as in us lyeth giving the said Margaret full power and
liberty to dispose of her self as she shall think fit witness my
hand this 24th day of August Anno dⁿⁱ 1683. Thomas Berry
signed and delivered in the presence of John Berry Sam^t Windsor James
Cusack. August 24th 1683. This day came before me Sam^t Windsor and
James Cusack and did acknowledge by him the above named Thomas
Berry signed the above written instrument. who afterwards did deliver
the same as his debt and good. The Quorum.

To all xpien people to whom these writings shall come
greeting know ye that John Berry and Francis Berry my wife of the
Province of East New Jersey for their good loves and valuable considerations
as for their moving and more especially for and in consideration of the special
affection that was borne unto our son Richard Berry have given, granted,
aliened, conveyed and confirmed and so by these presents give grant alien
convey and confirm unto our said son Richard Berry a certain
messuage and plantation lying and being upon the north side of the said
River New Barbados in the Province aforesaid the same to begin on the
north east side of Thomas Stagg the plantation and so to run upon a
North West line towards Passawitke River into the land by me lately
sold unto Walling Jacobs and on a South East line towards
the River into the South East side of the said River
Swamp that lay before the said plantation the same to be
the whole breadth of twenty fathoms on a North East line from
the said Thomas Stagg the plantation to the said messuage and so to
run into our said son Richard Berry the said messuage and
plantation in full and every the appurtenances thereto belonging
to him my said son Richard Berry his heirs and assigns
perpetually and forever on the same estate as if the
said John Berry had the same from the said Province and
the said Province and the said Province of the said John
Berry and Francis my wife or either of us our heirs and assigns
perpetually or by any other person or persons whatsoever by
our means or consent or procurement yielding and paying
unto our said Province of East New Jersey according to
proportion the said Province that shall be due to the said Province
from the day of our grants here witness in which was
drawn fixed our seals and subscribed our names this thirteenth
day of June one thousand six hundred eighty two and in the fourth
and thirtieth years of his Majesty King James the second
Berry signed sealed and delivered in the presence of Mr. Sandford
Thomas Mosell Esq^r in August Anno dⁿⁱ 1682 per side August per xxxi.
