How Communities Can Participate in

New Jersey High School Voter Registration Week

APRIL 14, 2024 - APRIL 20, 2024



Ways to Participate:

- Organize and run non-partisan voter registration tables/kiosks at community events and activities where high school students attend. You can create your own stand-alone activity or you can ask to set up a registration table at an existing community event of your choosing.
 - If you are unable to have an activity during NJ High School Voter Registration Week, you are encouraged to run one in the weeks following it. Keep in mind that the Voter Registration Deadline for the Primary Election is May 14th.
- How to register voters:
 - Register voters online. You will need a tablet, laptop or PC
 - Register voters using paper registration forms. The forms can be found at
- Distribute and/or share the provided event flyer on your social media pages
 - Ask eligible 17 & 18 year old students to register to vote by using the provided QR code link in the flyer to the Student Voting & Registration page.
- Share Lieutenant Governor Way's video on your social media pages on April 15th
- Work with high schools in your community to register students to vote

A Suggested Voter Registration Activity:

Feel free to create and run an activity that is best suited to your community's needs.

- Run the brief 2 minute video from Lt. Governor Way
- Share or present our provided self-guided slide presentation, <u>How to Be An</u> <u>Informed New Jersey Voter</u>
- Provide this attached program flyer to each student. The QR code on the flyer will take them to the Student Voting & Registration page on the NJ Votes website. That page is also located on the NJ Voter Information Portal at Vote.NJ.Gov. The student page contains:
 - A link to the state's <u>Online Voter</u> <u>Registration tool</u> so students can register on the spot.
 - For those students who need it, they will also find links to their county's postage paid <u>printable paper voter</u> <u>registration forms</u>.
 - A link for Mail-in application forms.

Ways Eligible Students Can Register to Vote:

- Have students scan the QR code on the event flyer to access the <u>Student Voter</u> <u>Registration and Voting Website</u>
- Direct students to the state's <u>Online</u> <u>Voter Registration Application</u>
- Print and distribute <u>Paper Voter</u> Registration Forms.

Primary Election Day & Key Dates

Here are key deadlines for the upcoming Primary Election :

• April 20:

Commencement of mailing of Mail-in Ballots for the Primary Election

• May 14:

Deadline to Register to Vote for the Primary Election

• May 28:

Deadline to apply for a Mail-in Ballot by Mail for Primary Election

May 29 – June 2: In-Person Early Voting Period

• June 3 at 3pm:

Deadline to apply for a Mail-in ballot in person at your County Clerk's office

• June 4:

Primary Election Day -Polls are open from 6:00am-8:00pm

Who is Eligible to Register to Vote:

- To register in New Jersey, you must be:
- A United States citizen;
- At least 17 years old, though you will not be able to vote until you have reached the age of 18:
- A resident of the county for 30 days before the election;
- You are not serving a sentence of Incarceration as a result of a conviction of an indictable offense under the laws of this or another state or of the United States. Citizens on parole or probation can register to vote in New Jersey.
