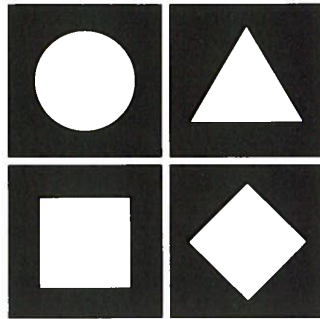

Since the first New Jersey Arts Annual in 1985, the New Jersey State Council on the Arts and the six participating museums have worked together to showcase the work of the state's best artists for New Jersey residents. In that first year, thirty-four artists participated in a Clay and Glass exhibition at The Morris Museum. Now, five years, nine shows, and 391 artists later, another New Jersey Arts Annual has been assembled.

The Fine Arts exhibition on view at the Jersey City Museum is another innovative step in this series of exhibitions. The Council commends the collaborative spirit of the Jersey City Museum, the Montclair Art Museum, The Morris Museum, The Newark Museum, the New Jersey State Museum, and The Noyes Museum, a unique national model of partnerships. With this forward-looking perspective, the Arts Annual continues to honor the creative genius of New Jersey's crafts and fine arts communities, and, in doing so, enhances our reputation as a "state for the arts."

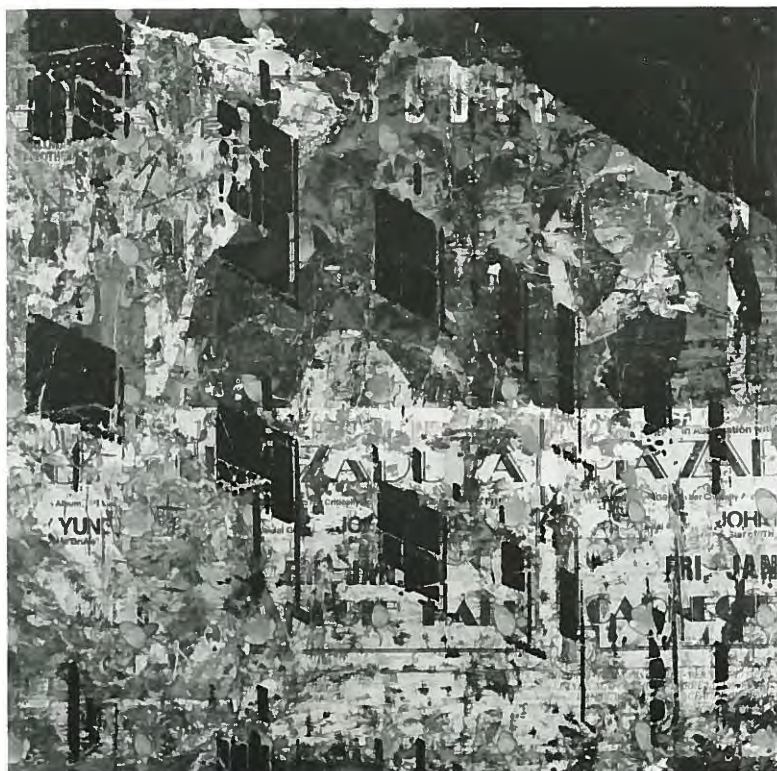

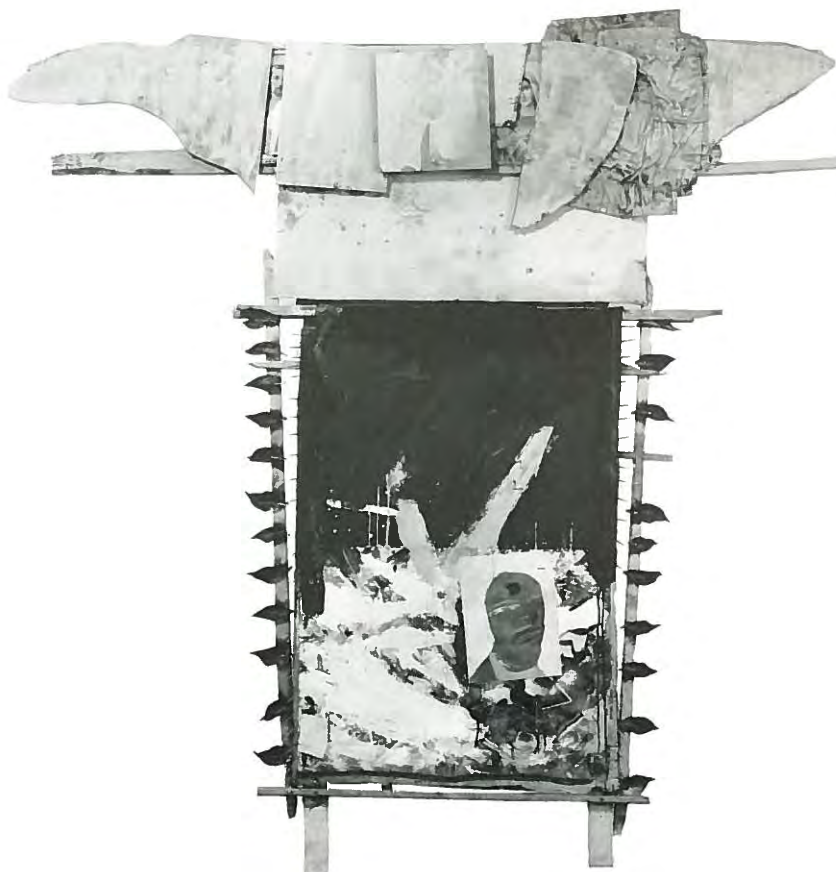

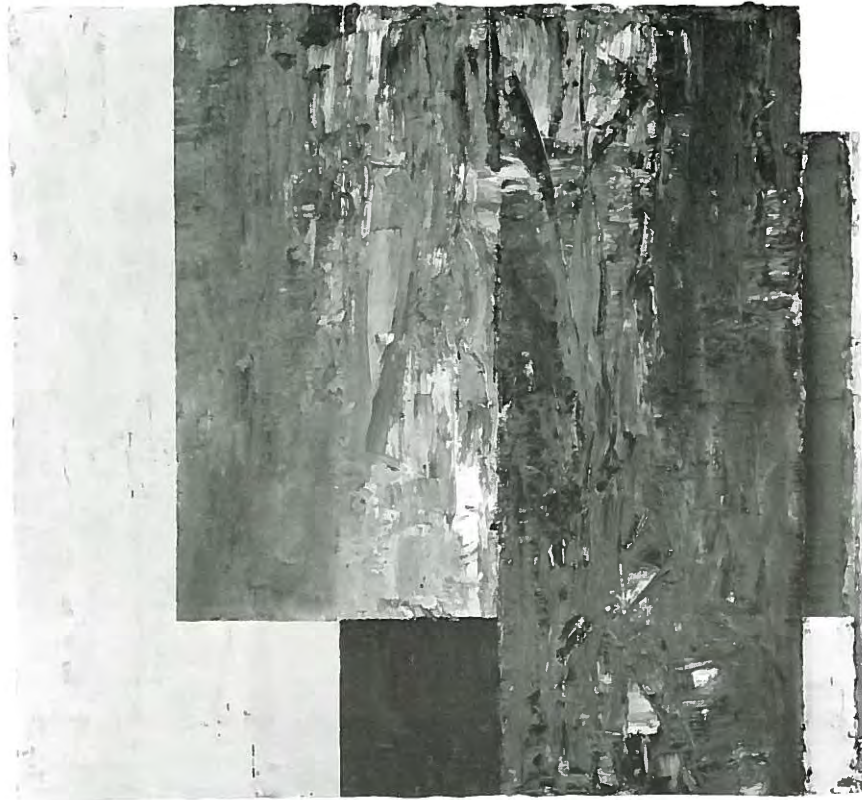

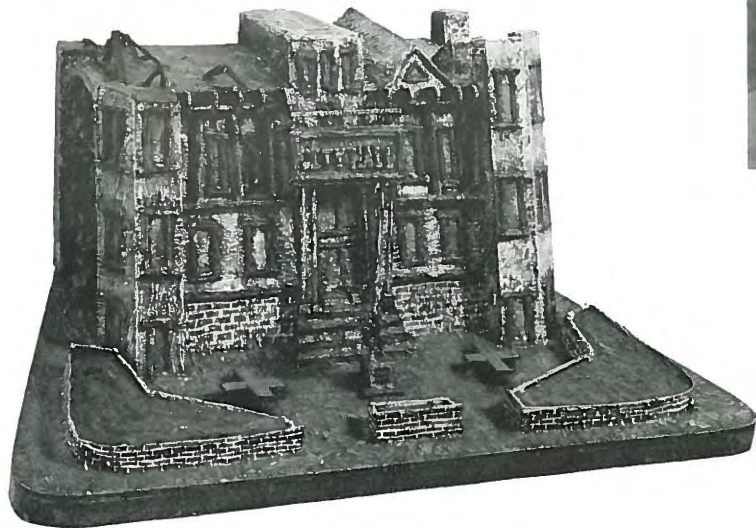

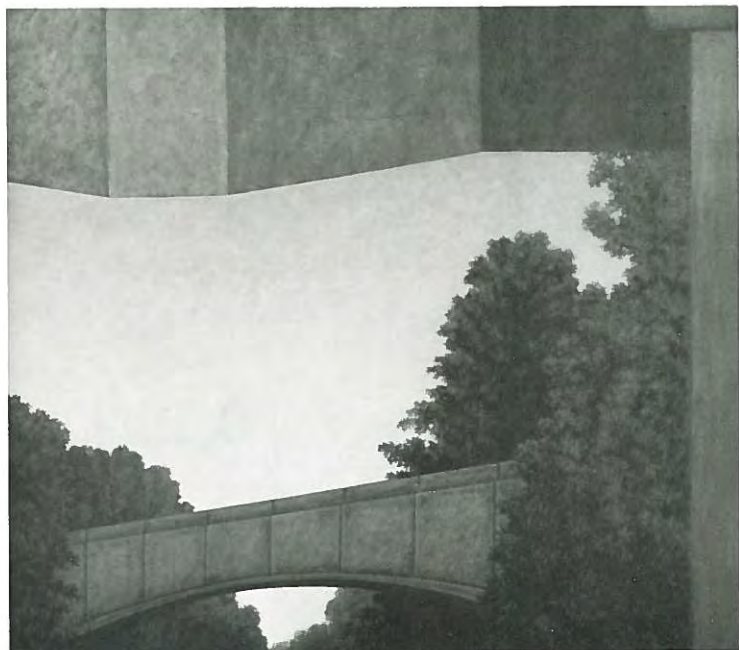

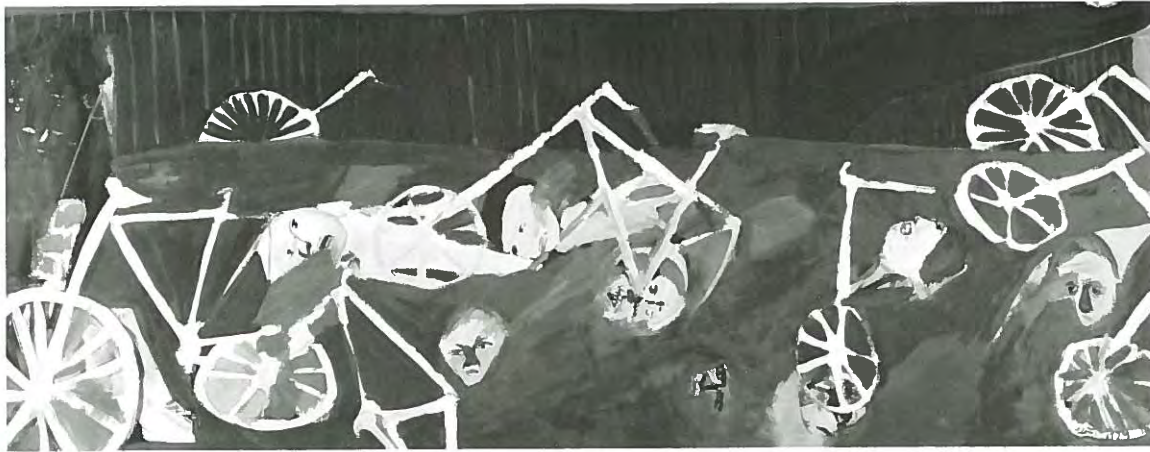

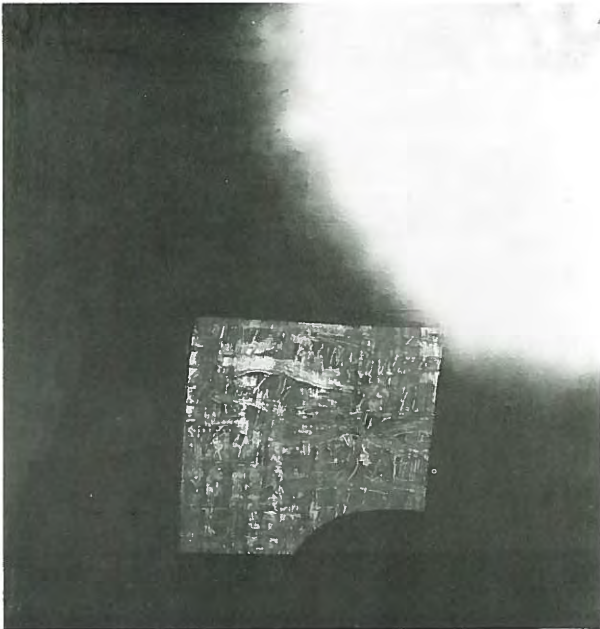

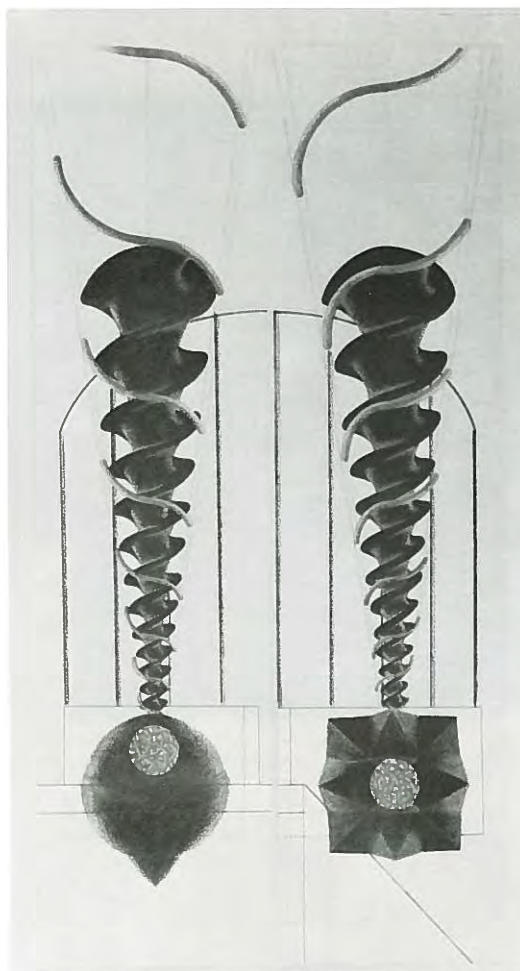

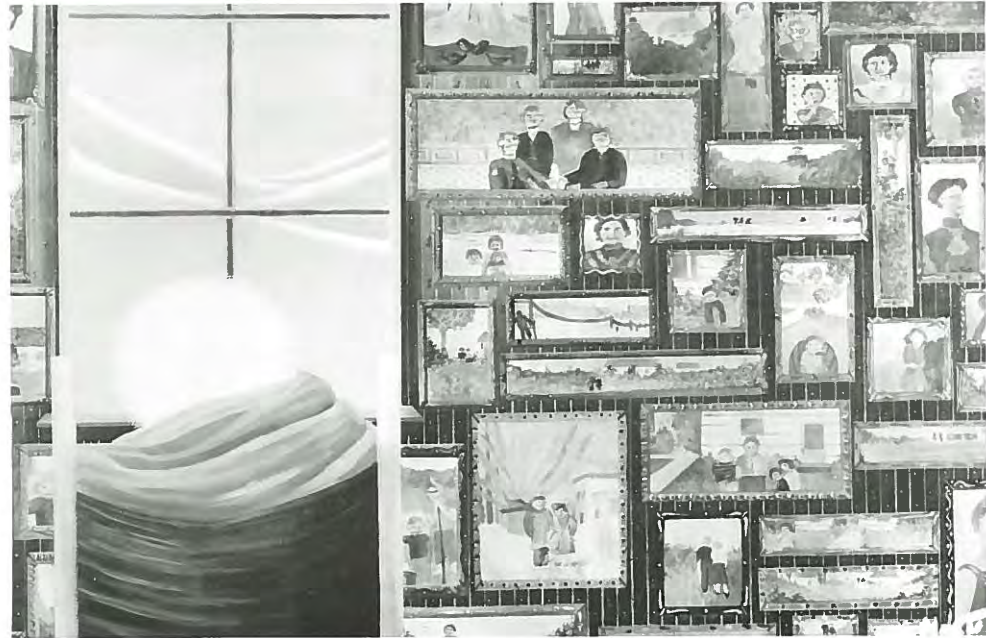

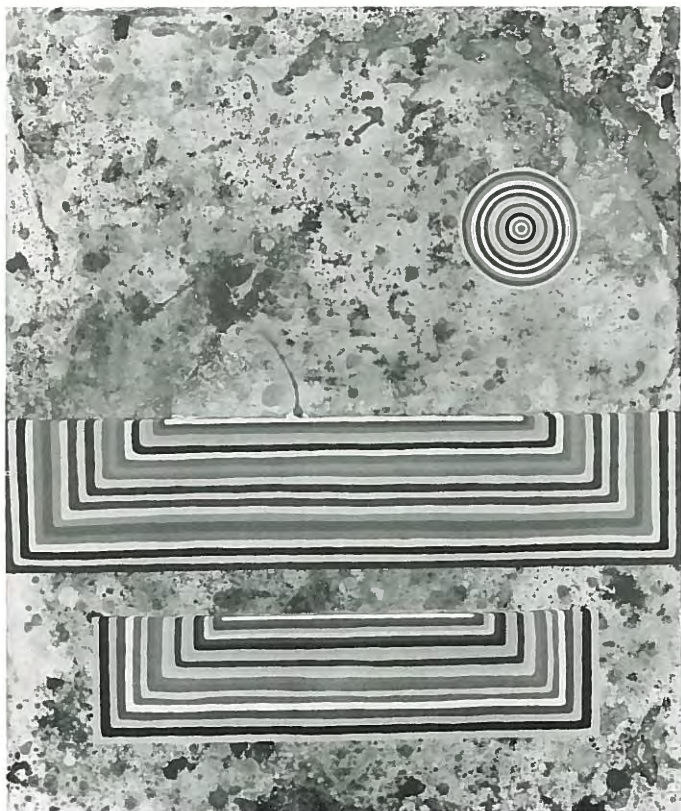

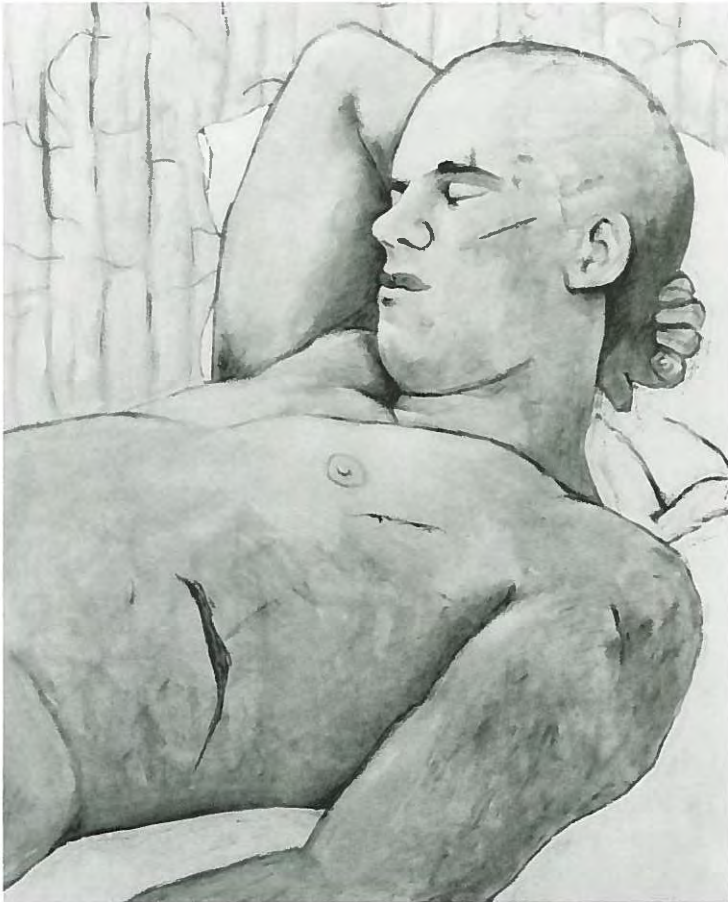
