### Update on Cross-Acceptance Activities

- ☉ All 21 counties are participating in cross-acceptance.
- ☉ The following 11 regional agencies have been asked to participate in the cross-acceptance process: Delaware and Raritan Canal Commission, Delaware River and Bay Authority, Delaware River Basin Commission, Delaware River Port Authority, Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission, Hackensack Meadowslands Development Commission, North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority, Palisades Interstate Park Commission, Pinelands Commission, Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, and South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization.
- ☉ As of October 31, 9 counties held Joint Public Information Meetings, where over 400 people brought their questions and recommendations for improving the State Plan.
