New Jersey Department of Transportation Rt. 72 over Rt. 9, Bridge Deck Replacement Stafford Township, Ocean County Public Information Center Tuesday, April 16, 2013 4 - 7 PM

The New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) is committed to developing transportation improvements that best balance transportation needs, the environment, community concerns and cost, will hold a Public Information Center to inform local residents and businesses of the staging and improvements in connection with the Rt. 72 over Rt. 9 Bridge Deck Replacement Project in Stafford Township, Ocean County. You are encouraged to actively participate by providing comments at the meeting, by mail or by e-mail.

The Meeting

The Public Information Center will be held at the Stafford Township Municipal Building, 260 East Bay Ave, Manahawkin on Tuesday, April 16, 2013 from 4 – 7 pm. Please plan to attend the meeting at a time that is convenient for you. You will have an opportunity to examine design plans, ask questions and discuss issues with representatives from NJDOT. Property owners of rental units are advised that tenants are invited and encouraged to participate.

Background

The concrete decks on both the Rt. 72 structures over Rt. 9 are in poor condition and must be replaced. The NJDOT has coordinated the planning and timing of this project with Stafford Township Officials. The major construction that requires long-term lane and ramp closures is scheduled to occur during non-summer months. Permanent lane reductions are prohibited along Rt. 72 westbound throughout the Atlantic Hurricane Season (June 1st through November 30th).

The Proposed Project

The NJDOT is proposing to replace, one at a time, concrete decks of the eastbound westbound bridges carrying Rt. 72 over Rt. 9. This work will be accomplished through construction that includes: (1) Closing the bridge being worked on and diverting its traffic via temporary diversionary roads crossing the median; (2) Reducing traffic along one direction of Rt. 72 from two lanes to one lane through the work area; (3) Closing and detouring designated ramps at the Rt. 9/Rt. 72 Interchange; and, (4) Constructing temporary improvements, including a traffic signal, at the intersection of Rt. 9/Rt. 72 eastbound ramps. The project also includes reconstructing shoulders along Rt. 72 as necessary accommodate diverted traffic, constructing concrete slabs along Rt. 72 approaching the minor repairs to the bridges, sandblasting/painting the structural steel. These improvements will be coordinated with the NJDOT's nearby Rt. 72 over Manahawkin Bay Bridge Project.

Environmental

The NJDOT obtained a Flood Hazard Area Permit from the NJDEP that grants permission to perform the designated construction required within the riparian zone of Manahawkin Mill Creek. Furthermore, the NJDOT has certified that the project, with its limited impacts, is in conformance with the NJDEP Storm Water Management Rules and the NJDEP Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Standards. No environmental constraints were identified for the proposed improvement. effort will be made to avoid or minimize impacts to any resources that should be identified within the project limits.

Estimated Schedule

Construction is estimated to start summer 2013.
