Summary

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1, N.J.A.C. 16:1A was scheduled to expire on August 30, 2024. As the Department of Transportation submitted this notice of proposal to the Office of Administrative Law prior to that date the expiration date was extended 180 days to February 26, 2025, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c(2).

The Department of Transportation (Department) has reviewed the rules proposed for readoption with amendments and determined that they remain necessary, reasonable, and proper for the purposes for which they were originally promulgated. Proposed amendments are necessary in order to update the Department's mission statement, contact information, websites, title names, and work unit locations as they relate to the Department's organizational chart and clarifying language and citations for copies of traffic control devises and maintenance records. The Department is proposing to readopt this chapter with the amendments, as set forth below.

This notice is excepted from the rulemaking calendar requirement, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 1:30-3.3(a)5, as the Department has provided a 60-day comment period for this notice of proposal.

N.J.A.C. 16:1A sets forth the Department's organizational structure; the procedures for rulemaking; procedures for obtaining government records; and provisions relating to the Department's logo.

The chapter is summarized as follows:

Subchapter 1 provides the Department's mission statement, logo, and organizational structure.

Subchapter 2 provides the definitions for the chapter.

Subchapter 3 provides the processes related to rulemaking.

Subchapter 4 provides the processes for obtaining records.

The proposed amendments are summarized as follows:

N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.1 is proposed for repeal and replacement to update the Department's mission statement.

N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a) is proposed for amendment to update the website. N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)1i is proposed for amendment to add title changes. N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)2ii(6) and (7) are added to include work units. N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)2iii is deleted in its entirety. The existing language is now codified at proposed new N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)2iii and existing N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)2vi. N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)2v(2) is proposed for amendment to update a unit title. Existing N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)2vi and vii. Existing N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)2vi through viii are deleted in their entirety and the language relocated to proposed N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)2vi and 3. N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)3 adds the Legislature, as a liaison duty for the Chief of Staff. N.J.A.C. 16:1A-1.2(a)4 is deleted in its entirety because the title is not used.

Existing N.J.A.C. 16:1A-4.1 is proposed for amendment to correct the phone number and website.

N.J.A.C. 16:1A-4.2(b) is proposed for amendment to correct the phone number and website. Existing N.J.A.C. 16:1A-4.2(c) is proposed for amendment to correct the citation and delete reference to maintenance records. Maintenance records requests are now codified at proposed new N.J.A.C. 16:1A-4.2(d).

Existing N.J.A.C. 16:1A-4.5(a) is proposed for amendment to correct a unit name. Existing N.J.A.C. 16:1A-4.5(b) is proposed for amendment to include reference to maintenance record requests, correct a unit name, and mailing address.

N.J.A.C. 16:1A-4.7(a) through (c) are proposed for amendment to correct a unit name.

N.J.A.C. 16:1A-4.8(a) is proposed for amendment to update a website and subsection (b) is proposed for amendment to correct the phone number and website.

Social Impact

The rules proposed for readoption with amendments have a beneficial social impact. The rules proposed for readoption with amendments provide the public with the organizational structure of the Department; the procedures for rulemaking; procedures for requesting government records; and provisions relating to the Department's logo. The proposed amendments provide updated contact information and websites.

Economic Impact

The rules proposed for readoption with amendments do not change existing fees or charges on the public. Information related to copies for traffic control device records and traffic control maintenance records has been clarified and citations updated.

Federal Standards Statement

A Federal standards analysis pursuant to Executive Order No. 27 (1994) and P.L. 1995, c. 65, is not required because the rules proposed for readoption with amendments are within the authority of State statute only and are not subject to Federal requirements or standards.

Jobs Impact

The rules proposed for readoption with amendments have not resulted, and will not result, in the generation or loss of jobs. The rules proposed for readoption with amendments are intended to describe the organizational structure and provide the procedures for obtaining government records; the procedures for rulemaking; and provisions relating to the Department's logo.

Agriculture Industry Impact

The rules proposed for readoption with amendments have no impact on the agriculture industry in New Jersey. The rules proposed for readoption with amendments are not intended to regulate farming, crop, or animal production.

Regulatory Flexibility Analysis

The rules proposed for readoption with amendments provide the public with the organizational structure of the Department; the procedures for rulemaking; procedures for requesting government records; and provisions relating to the Department's logo. Members of the affected public may include small businesses, as the term is defined by the Regulatory Flexibility Act, N.J.S.A. 52:14B-16 et seq. The Department does not feel that any differentiation should be made in the rules proposed for readoption with amendments based upon business size. The procedures are in keeping with the requirements of the Administrative Procedure Act, N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 et seq., and the Open Public Records Act, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1 et seq. No lesser requirements or exceptions are provided for small businesses.

Housing Affordability Impact Analysis

The rules proposed for readoption with amendments will have no impact on the affordability of housing in New Jersey. The rules proposed for readoption with amendments provide the public with the Department's organizational structure; the procedures for obtaining copies of government records; rulemaking procedures; and provisions relating to the Department's logo. The Department believes that it is extremely unlikely that the rules proposed for readoption with amendments would bring about a change in the average costs associated with housing.

Smart Growth Development Impact Analysis

The rules proposed for readoption with amendments will have no impact on smart growth. The Department believes that it is extremely unlikely that the rules proposed for readoption with amendments would bring about a change in housing production in Planning Areas 1 or 2, or within designated centers, pursuant to the State Development and Redevelopment Plan because the rules proposed for readoption with amendments concern the Department's organizational structure; the procedures for obtaining copies of government records; rulemaking procedures; and provisions relating to the Department's logo.

Racial and Ethnic Community Criminal Justice and Public Safety Impact
