<u>Bill: S2430/A3147/A3874</u>, signed by Governor Corzine on July 18, 2007, changes when proof of veteran status is required for civil service examinations for certain veterans. Veterans will be able to establish veteran status 8 days prior to list issuance.

New Jersey values the contributions that our veterans have made, and continue to make, for our country's freedom and for other nations around the world. As such, New Jersey's merit system provides **absolute veterans preference** in employee selection. This means that qualified veterans are placed at the top of an open competitive employment list ahead of non-veterans regardless of their scores. Disabled veterans and veterans are placed on promotional lists according to their scores, but they have preference over non-veterans when a disabled veteran or veteran is at the top of a certification of the list to an appointing authority.

#### How Veteran's Preference Works

The Civil Service Commission operates under what is commonly known as the "**Rule of Three**." The "Rule of Three" means that after an open competitive or promotional exam is held, the Appointing Authority may select any candidate from the top three ranks unless a veteran is in the top three ranks as noted below. Veteran's Preference gives all eligible Disabled Veterans and Veterans priority on the certified lists. However, the "Rule of Three" is applied differently to <u>Open Competitive Exams</u> than to <u>Promotional Exams</u>.

#### **REQUIREMENTS FOR CIVIL SERVICE VETERAN'S PREFERENCE ELIGIBILITY**

Veterans are provided an absolute Veterans Preference when applying for a New Jersey civil service position.

This means that qualified New Jersey Veterans who receive a passing score are placed at the top of open competitive employment lists, ahead of Non-Veterans, regardless of their scores.

Disabled Veterans are given the highest preference, being placed above both Veterans and Non-Veterans on open competitive employment lists.

Veterans Preference can be established as late as 8 days prior to an open competitive employment list being issued.

#### **Qualifying for Veterans Preference**

To qualify for Veterans Preference, the Veteran must have served on active duty during a qualifying war era.

The following documents will be needed to prove this service occurred:

- WD Form 53-55 or DD Form 214
- Honorable Discharge Certificate
- Additional documents as needed

The surviving spouse of a Veteran who died outside of service is entitled to the same preference as the Veteran, up until they remarry.

#### **Qualifying for Disabled Veterans Preference**

To qualify for Disabled Veterans Preference, all requirements for Veterans Preference must be met, and the Veteran must be receiving at least a 10% disability compensation from the US Department of Veterans Affairs.

The following document will be needed to prove this disability:

VA Disability Award Letter

*The spouse of a Disabled Veteran* is entitled to the same preference as the Disabled Veteran, provided they are not employed in a civil service position. The Disabled Veteran must also waive all preference for the duration of their spouse's civil service employment.

The surviving spouse of a Disabled Veteran is entitled to the same preference as the Disabled Veteran, up until they remarry.

The surviving spouse of any Veteran who died in service is entitled to the Disabled Veteran Preference, up until they remarry.

The parent of any Veteran who died in service is entitled to the Disabled Veteran Preference. If there is a surviving spouse as well, only one can claim preference.

#### **Qualifying War Era Service Dates**

The amount of active duty service required to qualify for Veterans Preference varies by war era.

Regardless of war era, active duty service accrued during the following Reserve or National Guard training obligations does NOT count towards the Veterans Preference active duty requirement:

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To qualify for Veterans Preference, the following war eras require at least 90 days of active duty service, begun within the specified windows:

To qualify for Veterans Preference, the following war eras require:

- At least 14 days of active duty service begun within the specified window OR at least 1 day of active duty service begun within the specified window and received a service incurred injury or disability
- The service was in the geographic area or on a ship patrolling the territorial water of the nation (or in airspace over it, in the case of Bosnia/Herzegovina)

#### **Establishing Civil Service Veterans Preference**

Download and fill out a <u>Civil Service Veteran Preference Claim Form</u> (21 KB PDF). Once completed, please follow the written instructions found on the form to mail in your claim.

If you established your Veterans Preference prior to April 1, 1980, you must reestablish your preference, as Veteran Preference numbers issued prior to this date are void.

## How Veteran's Preference Works

## Open Competitive Exams

Once a candidate passes all parts of the exam, Veteran's Preference becomes absolute when creating the rank of the eligible lists. Disable Veterans (DV), in order of their scores, have absolute preference over all other candidates. Then, Veterans, in order of their scores, are ranked the next highest. Non veterans are ranked according to their scores. The "Rule of Three" does not apply if there are Disabled Veterans and Veterans on the list.

Robert Brown, Charles Black and Mary White must be offered appointments in order of their rank because they are veterans. After all of the veterans are appointed or removed, the appointing authority may then offer the next appointment to either John Green, Jane Silver or Tom Gold under the rule of three because they are the three highest ranking non veterans.

## Promotional Exams

Promotional Exam eligible lists differ from Open Competitive lists in that all candidates, including veterans, are ranked by their score. There is no distinction among Disabled Veterans and Veterans in Promotional Exams. The Law specifies that when a veteran is number one on a promotional certification, a nonveteran cannot be appointed. If the name of more than one veteran appears on the certification, any veteran among the top three interested may be appointed. If there is a tie, the names of Veterans will be listed first within each rank. For example:

## CIVIL SERVICE VETERAN'S PREFERENCE CLAIM FORM

To be eligible for **veteran's preference/status** under New Jersey Law, one must have served on active duty during one of the following periods. Proper documentation is required (WD Form 53-55, DD Form 214, Honorable Discharge Certificate, and VA Disability Award Letter).

- 1. **World War II:** 90 days active duty on or after September 16, 1940 and must have begun on or before December 31, 1946.
- 2. **Korean Conflict**: 90 days active duty on or after June 23, 1950 and must have begun on or before January 31, 1955.
- 3. **Vietnam Conflict**: 90 days active duty on or after December 31, 1960 and must have begun on or before May 7, 1975.

To be eligible for **veteran's preference/status** under New Jersey Law for the following peacekeeping missions, one must have served in Lebanon, Grenada, Panama, the Persian Gulf, Bosnia, Herzegovina, Haiti, Operation Enduring Freedom, or Operation Iraqi Freedom, or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the territorial waters of that nation for a period of at least 14 days beginning on or before the date of termination of that mission or operation. Proper documentation is required (DD Form 214, Honorable Discharge Certificate, and VA Disability Award Letter).

- 1. Lebanon Crisis: 14 days on or after July 1, 1958, commencing on or before November 1, 1958.
- 2. Lebanon: 14 days on or after September 26, 1982 and must have begun on or before December 1, 1987.
- 3. Grenada: 14 days on or after October 23, 1983 and must have begun on or before November 21, 1983.
- 4. Panama: 14 days on or after December 20, 1989 and must have begun on or before January 31, 1990.
- 5. Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm: 14 days on or after August 2, 1990 to February 28, 1991.
- 6. Somalia: 14 days on or after December 5, 1992 and must have begun on or before March 31, 1994.
- 7. Bosnia and Herzegovina (Operation Joint Endeavor/Operation Joint Guard): 14 days on or after November 20, 1995 and on or before June 20, 1998.
- 8. **Haiti (Operation Uphold Democracy):** 14 days on or after September 19, 1994 and on or before March 31, 1995.
- 9. **Operation Enduring Freedom:** 14 days on or after September 11, 2001.
- 10. Operation Iraqi Freedom: 14 days on or after March 19, 2003.
- 11. Operations Southern and Northern Watch: 14 days on or after August 27, 1992

To be eligible for **disabled veteran's preference**, one must be a "veteran" as described above and must have incurred a disability for which the veteran is receiving 10% or greater disability compensation from the US Department of Veterans Affairs. Spouses of disabled veterans, surviving spouses of disabled veterans or veterans and parents of veterans who died in service are eligible for preference, if the veteran would have been eligible for veteran's preference. Proper documentation is required (DD Form 214, Honorable Discharge Certificate, and VA Disability Award Letter).

**NOTE:** Individuals whose only active service was for training (basic training, advanced training, officer candidate school, weekend drills, and annual training) in connection with a Reserve or National Guard obligation are not eligible for Veteran's Preference/Status.

**NOTE:** Merchant Marine Personnel who served in World War II, and who present a DD-214 which establishes 90 days of active service during the period noted above, are entitled to Veteran's Preference.
