FOREWORD

The Grants Management Office is required to report annually to the Legislature, pursuant to section 2 of P.L. 1991, c. 164 (C:52:14-19.1), “a report that describes all federal funds received by State agencies in the preceding fiscal year”. In fulfillment of this statutory obligation, the New Jersey Department of the Treasury’s Grants Management Office is proud to present the second edition of the *Federal Funds to New Jersey State Agencies, Fiscal Years 2023-2025* report.

This edition provides a comprehensive guide to the federal funds received by State agencies during the preceding fiscal year. To present a complete picture of federal grant revenue activity, the report also includes data from FY2023 and FY2024. Federal receipts are presented on a State fiscal year basis and accompanied by descriptive program information to support a clearer understanding of the federal programs used by New Jersey State agencies and the funding levels associated with each. All figures reflect actual reimbursements or cash receipts recorded during the fiscal year and do not represent federal award totals, grant authorizations, or funds obligated but not yet drawn down.

Federal grant funding can vary from year to year for several reasons, including the timing of reimbursements, the scheduled tapering or expiration of multi-year awards, and the conclusion of temporary programs such as those established in response to COVID-19. Shifts in annual receipts may also reflect changes in program activity or the natural progression of grants nearing closeout. Despite these fluctuations, State agencies continue to secure and manage federal funds, replenishing revenue streams through ongoing program activity and the pursuit of new federal opportunities.

It is the hope of the Grants Management Office that this report will serve as a valuable resource for legislators, enhancing their understanding of the federal programs that support State operations and the levels at which these programs are funded. As this report will be published annually, the GMO welcomes feedback to ensure it continues to meet the needs of its audience and remains a reliable source of information on federal contributions to New Jersey State agencies.

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INTRODUCTION

The Grants Management Office is required to report annually to the Legislature, pursuant to section 2 of P.L. 1991, c. 164 (C.52:14-19.1), on all federal funds received by State agencies in the preceding fiscal year.

The Federal Funds to State Agencies report provides a comprehensive summary of all federal receipts recorded in the New Jersey Comprehensive Financial System during the most recent fiscal year. It presents federal grant revenue on a State fiscal year basis and includes concise descriptive information for each federal program to help readers understand the purpose, structure, and funding levels of the programs that support State operations. All figures reflect actual reimbursements or cash receipts recorded during the fiscal year and do not represent federal award totals or grant authorizations.

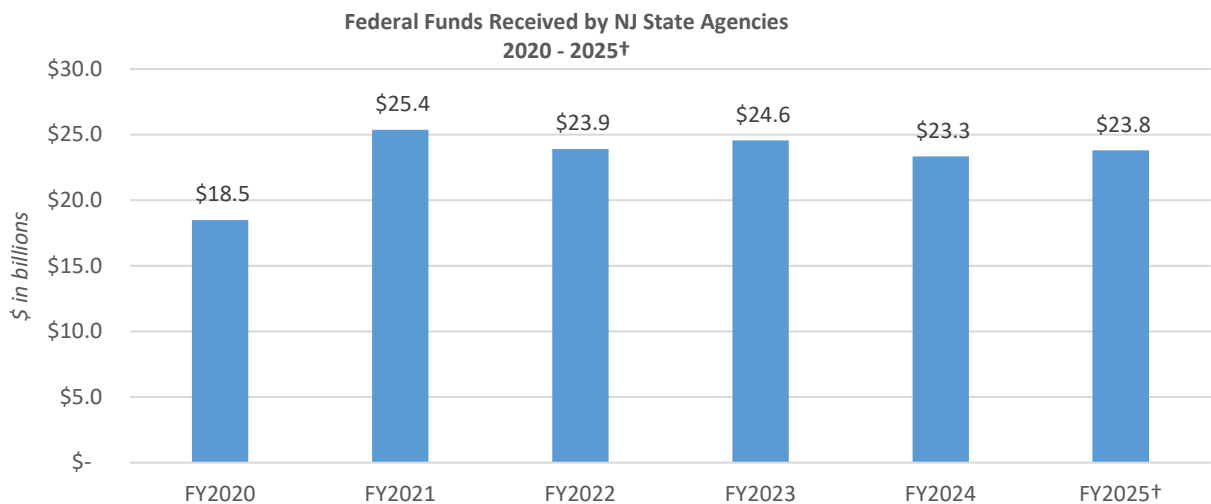
Overview

In FY2025, the State of New Jersey received an estimated \$23.8 billion in federal funding, as detailed in Appendix B. Agencies collectively drew down funding from 310 federal programs across 21 federal agencies. These federal receipts supported 595 State-administered programs. Table 1 and Figure 1 outlines the annual federal receipts recorded by the State from FY2020 through FY2025.

Figure 1: Federal Funds Received by New Jersey State Agencies, 2020 – 2025† (Billions of dollars)

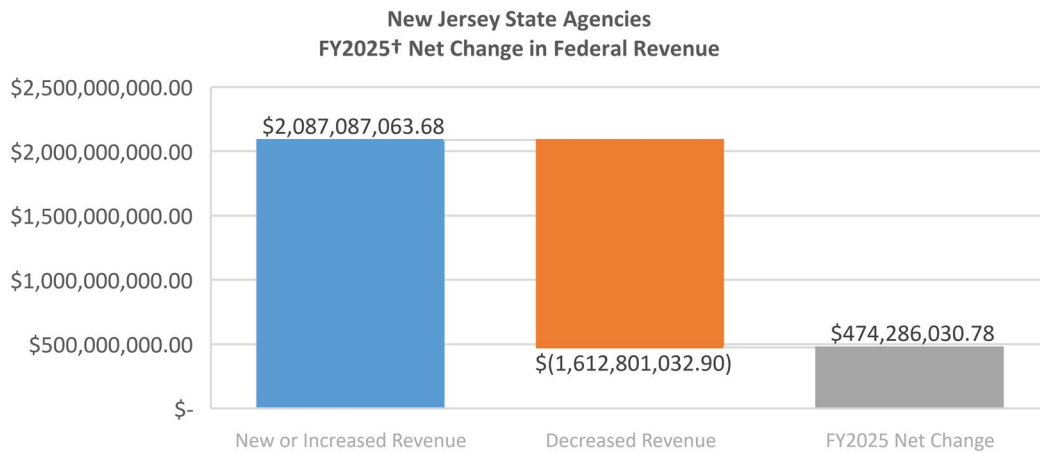


† FY2025 figures are unaudited and reflect receipts recorded in the New Jersey Comprehensive Financial System (NJCFIS) as of August 24, 2025. All figures represent actual reimbursements/receipts, not award amounts or total federal authorizations.

In FY2025, the State of New Jersey received \$2.09 billion in new or increased federal receipts. These gains were offset by \$1.61 billion in reduced receipts compared to FY2024, including reductions from programs for which fewer or no receipts were recorded during the fiscal year. In FY2025, an estimated 78% of reduced receipts can be attributed to the tapering or absence of pandemic-related funding.

After accounting for both increases and reductions, the State recorded a net year-over-year increase of \$474.29 million, resulting in a positive net change of 2% for the fiscal year. Figure 2 illustrates the net change in federal receipts for FY2025.

Figure 2: New Jersey State Agencies FY2025 Net Change in Federal Revenue



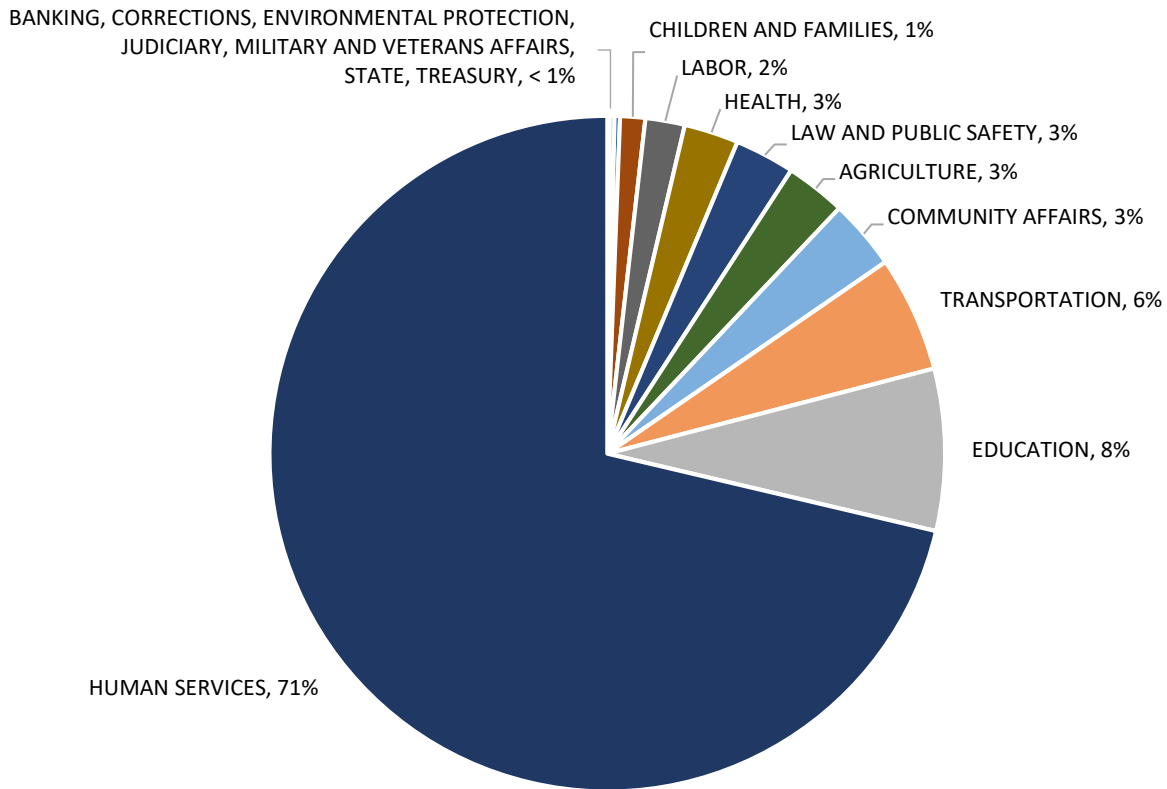
Federal revenue changes between FY2024 and FY2025 varied across State agencies. Notable increases in federal revenue were observed by the Departments of Human Services, Transportation, and Community Affairs. In contrast, the Departments of Education, Health, and Labor and Workforce Development experienced reductions in revenue. A detailed comparison of federal revenue changes for all State agencies is provided in Appendix A.

As shown in Figure 3 and Table 2, the Department of Human Services accounted for the largest share of federal revenue, receiving 71% of the statewide total. The Departments of Education and Transportation followed with 8% and 6%, respectively. All other departments, including Health, Agriculture, Community Affairs, and Law and Public Safety each received 3% or less of the total federal revenue.

Using This Report

Federal program profiles for each State agency make up the bulk of this Annual Report. These profiles provide detailed descriptions of each program, the FY2025 State programs they supported, and the funding levels they received in FYs 2023-2025. Only programs for which federal funds were received directly from the federal government are included. Programs in which a State agency received funds from another State agency (subgrants) have been excluded to avoid “double counting,” or falsely inflating the dollar totals.

Negative amounts include, but are not limited to, a combination of refunds or reimbursements back to the State from vendors for costs under the relevant federal grant. These amounts represent the subsequent return of those funds back to the federal government.

For purposes of this report, a “receipt” refers to federal funds that have been reimbursed to or deposited into the New Jersey Comprehensive Financial System during the fiscal year. Receipts represent actual cash received and recorded in the accounting system; they do not reflect federal award amounts, total grant authorizations, or funds that have been obligated but not yet drawn down.

Federal grant receipts fluctuate from year to year due to the timing of drawdowns, the progression of multiyear awards, and the tapering or expiration of time limited programs, including COVID-related funding. Because this report reflects actual cash receipts recorded during each fiscal year annual amounts may shift as programs enter new phases or conclude. These variations are expected within federal grant administration. The year over year data presented throughout the report provides a clear picture of these changes and illustrated how State agencies continue to access and manage available federal funds across programs.

Throughout the report, new or first-time federal programs are marked with an asterisk (*), making them easy to identify. The Table of Contents provides an overview of the federal programs utilized by State agencies from FY2023 through FY2025 and indicates where

each program's detailed profile can be found. For an agency-level summary, Appendix A presents federal revenue totals by State agency.

Unless otherwise noted, federal programs are listed by their Assistance Listing number. Each program profile includes:

- The administering federal agency
- A description of the federal program
- The types of assistance
- The intended use of the assistance
- Formula and matching requirements
- The federal account identification number
- A table showing federal revenue received by the state agency in FY2023, FY2024 and estimated revenue for FY 2025
- The State programs supported by FY 2025 funding

Presents a side-by-side comparison of total federal revenue received by New Jersey State agencies for fiscal years 2023 through 2025. It highlights changes in revenue between FY2024 and FY2025, offering insights into trends across State agencies over time.

Appendix B: Direct Federal Aid to New Jersey State Agencies by Federal Program, FY2023–FY2025

Provides a program-level analysis of federal aid received by New Jersey State agencies. It compares revenue from federal programs for fiscal years 2023 through 2025, with a focus on changes in funding levels between FY2024 and FY2025.

APPENDIX C: New, First Time: Federal Programs to New Jersey State Agencies, FY2025

Identifies federal programs that were receipted by a New Jersey State agency for the first time in FY2025. A federal program is considered new or first-time if the agency had not recorded receipts for that program during the previous five fiscal years.

Appendix D: New, First-Time State Programs in FY2025

Highlights new or first-time state administered programs or initiatives receipted for the first time in FY2025. Programs are considered new or first-time if they were not funded within the same agency during the previous five fiscal years. In some cases, programs may have similar or related names, but only those with no recorded receipts during the lookback period are classified as new for the report.

Appendix E: Assistance Listing

Provides a comprehensive directory of federal assistance programs to ensure clarity and consistency in identifying and tracking federal funding sources.

Appendix F: Related Federal Assistance Programs

Lists related federal assistance programs for FY2023–FY2025 to help identify additional opportunities. These listings highlight other federal programs that serve similar purposes or populations, offering potential pathways for further funding or collaboration.

Information Sources

The source for the fiscal data included in *the Federal Funds to New Jersey State Agencies* report were provided by the New Jersey Department of the Treasury's Office of Management and Budget. The data reflects all federal revenue received by the State of New Jersey between Fiscal Years 2020-2025. The Fiscal Year 2025 data is as of August 24, 2025 and still subject to change pending the final Single Audit for Fiscal Year 2025. The data was extracted from the New Jersey Comprehensive Financial System, which is the State's accounting system. It should also be noted that the data *does not* include federal revenues awarded and provided directly to authorities or other quasi-governmental agencies that are not on the State's accounting system.

Program titles listed under FY2025 State Programs Supported are reported as they appear in the New Jersey Comprehensive Financial Management System (NJCMS). To preserve the integrity of the source data, no edits were made to program titles, including correction of typographical errors.

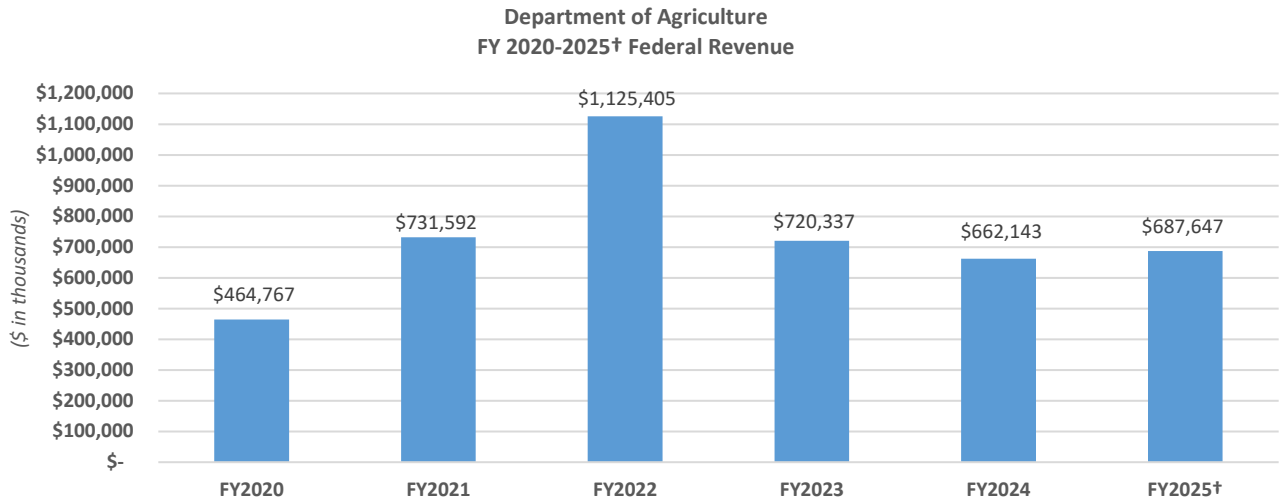
For purposes of this report, a “receipt” refers to federal funds that have been reimbursed to or deposited into the NJCFS during the fiscal year. Receipts represent actual cash received by the State and recorded in the accounting system, and does not reflect federal awards amounts, total grant authorizations, or funds that have been obligated but not yet drawn down.

The primary source for the federal program descriptive information is the Assistance Listing (formerly and commonly referred to as Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA)) from SAM.gov. The federal programs, with few exceptions, are identified by Assistance Listing number. The first two digits of the number identify the federal agency from which the grant originates. The next three digits identify the specific grant within each agency. Appendix E shows the basic numbering scheme and the corresponding federal agencies.

NJ DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

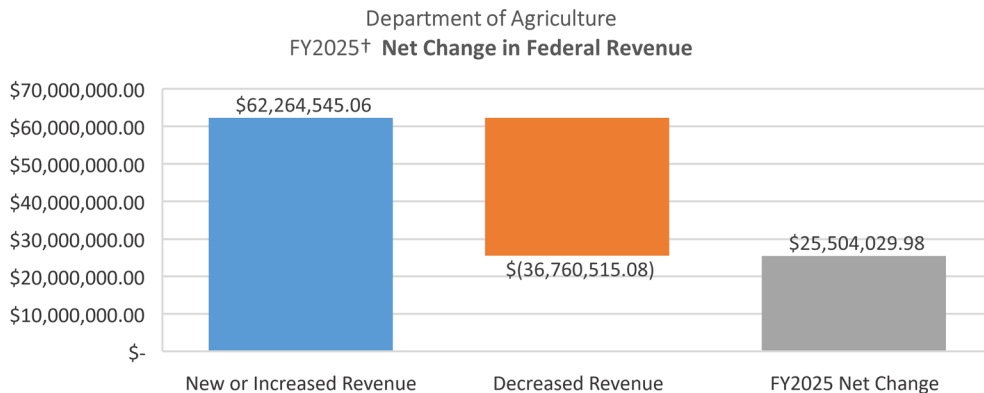
Figure 4: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Agriculture, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

In FY2025, the Department of Agriculture received a total of \$687,647,066.47 in federal funding. The agency received funding from 23 federal programs across 2 federal agencies. These funds supported 52 State of New Jersey programs, including 4 new initiatives. Figure 4 outlines the annual federal receipts recorded by the Department of Agriculture from FY2020 through FY2025.

† FY2025 figures are unaudited and reflect receipts recorded in the New Jersey Comprehensive Financial System (NJCFS) as of 8/24/2025. All figures represent actual reimbursements/receipts, not award amounts or total federal authorizations.

In FY2025, the Department of Agriculture received \$62.26 million in new or increased federal receipts. These gains were offset by \$36.76 million in reduced receipts compared to FY2024, including reductions from programs for which fewer or no receipts were recorded during the fiscal year. After accounting for both increases and reductions relative to FY2024, the agency recorded a net year-over-year increase of \$25.50 million, resulting in a positive net change of 4% for the fiscal year. Figure 5 illustrates the net change in federal receipts for FY2025.

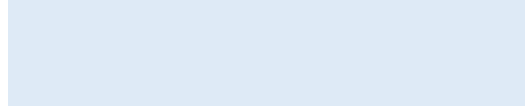

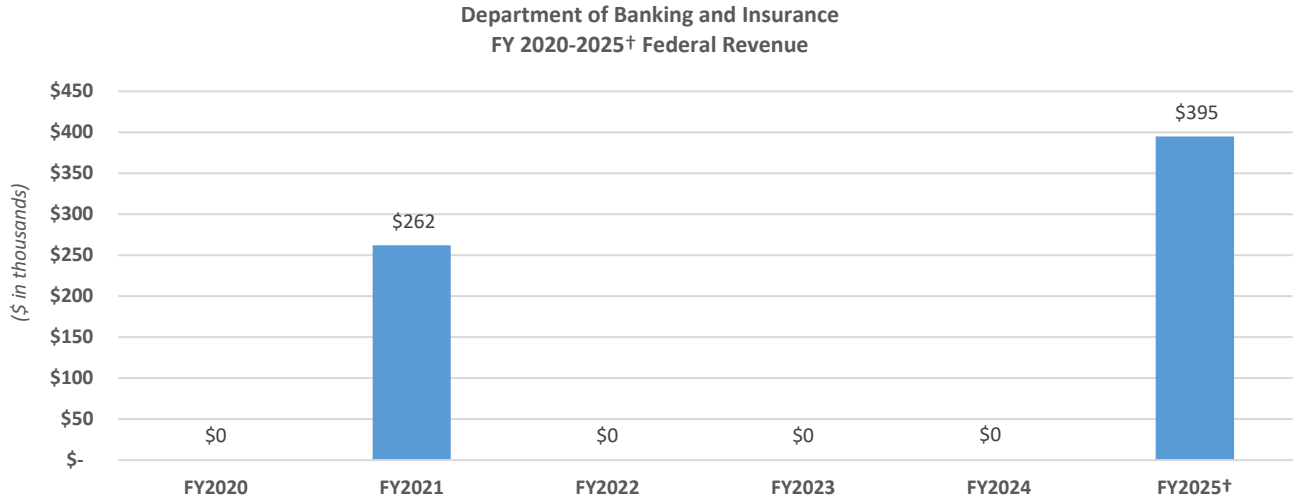

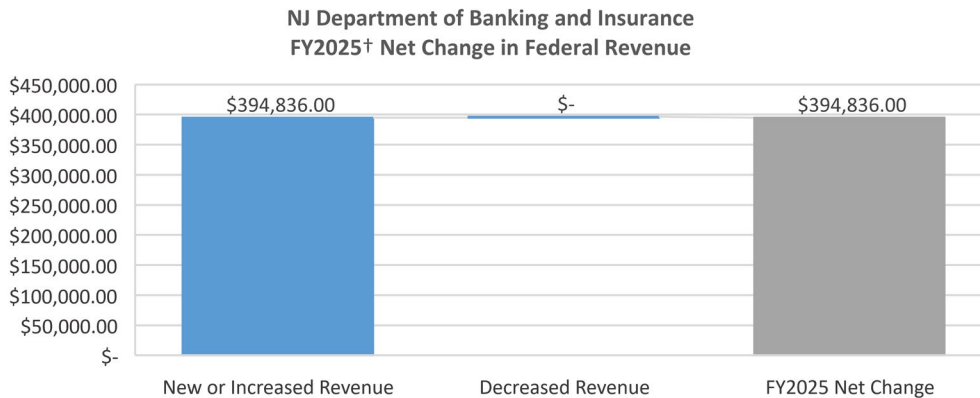
Figure 6: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Banking and Insurance, FY2020 – FY2025[†] (\$ in thousands)

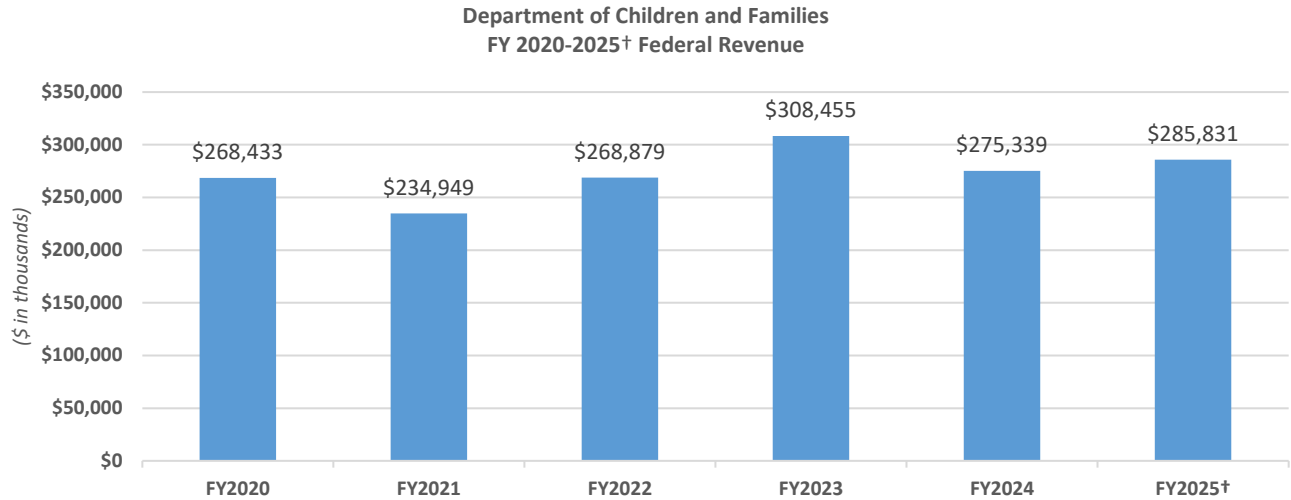

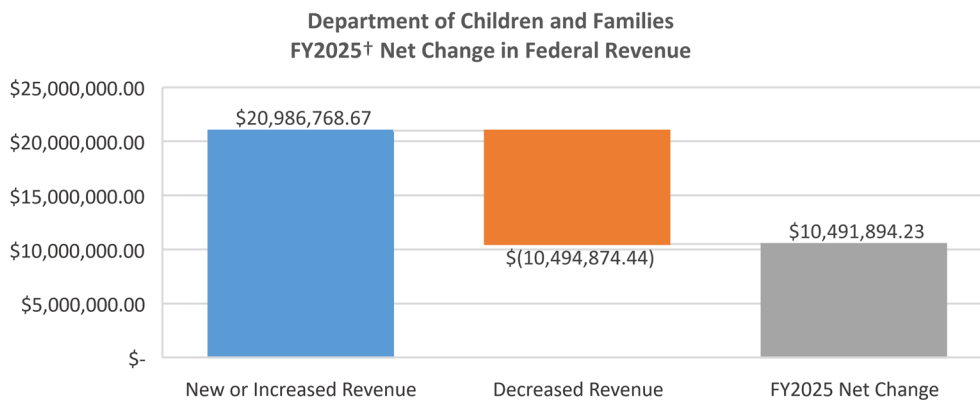
Figure 8: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Children and Families, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

After accounting for both increases and reductions relative to FY2024, the agency recorded a net year-over-year increase of \$10.49 million, resulting in a positive net change of 4% for the fiscal year. 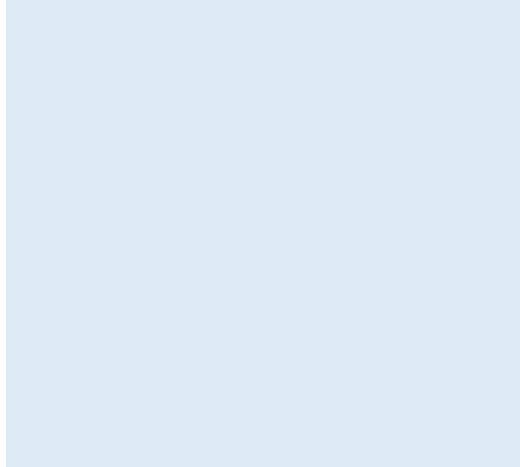

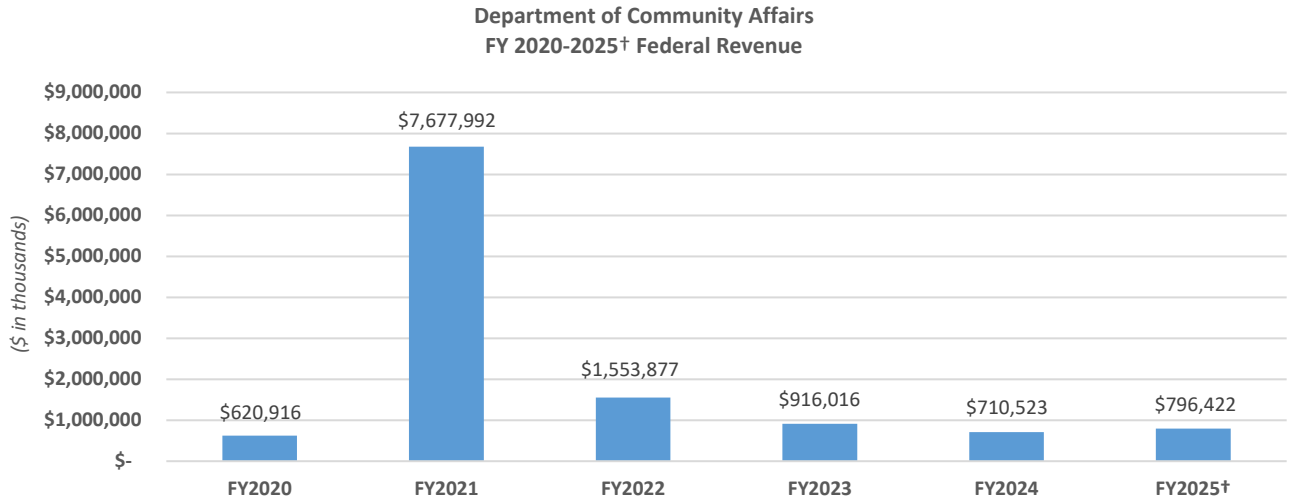

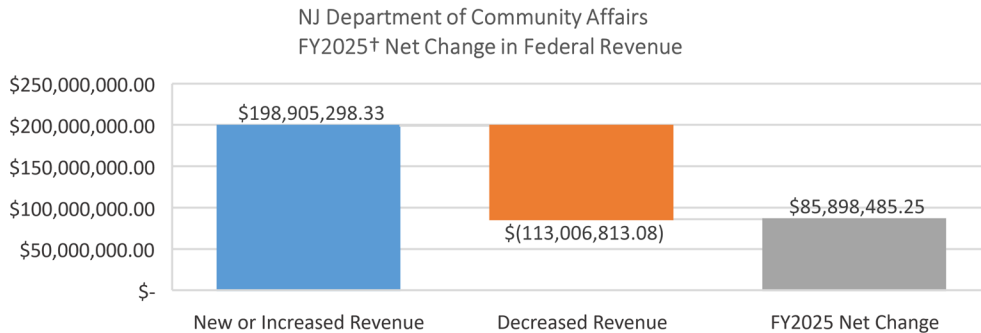
Figure 10: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Community Affairs, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

In FY2025, the Department of Community Affairs received a total of \$796,421,855.90 in federal funding. The agency received funding from 19 federal programs across 4 federal agencies. These funds supported 37 State of New Jersey programs, including 1 new initiative. Figure 10 outlines the annual federal receipts recorded by the Department of Community Affairs from FY2020 through FY2025.

In FY2025, the Department of Community Affairs received \$198.91 million in new or increased federal receipts. These gains were offset by \$113.01 million in reduced receipts compared to FY2024, including reductions from programs for which fewer or no receipts were recorded during the fiscal year. After accounting for both increases and reductions relative to FY2024, the agency recorded a net year-over-year increase of \$85.90 million, resulting in a positive net change of 12% for the fiscal year. Figure 11 illustrates the net change in federal receipts for FY2025.

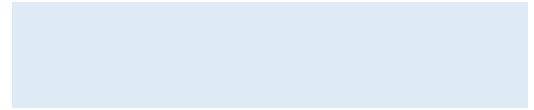

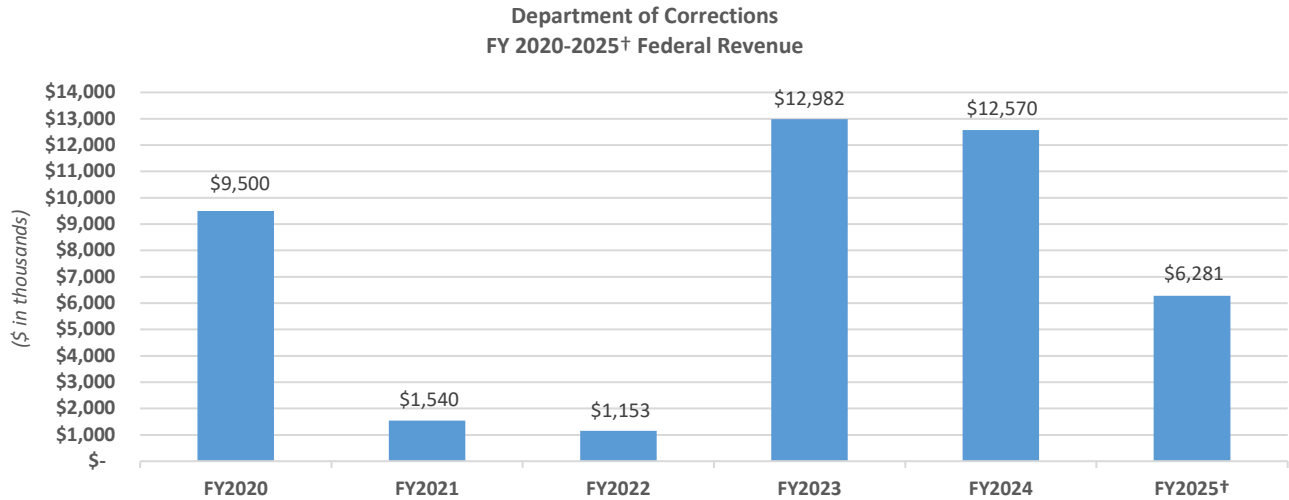

NJ DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

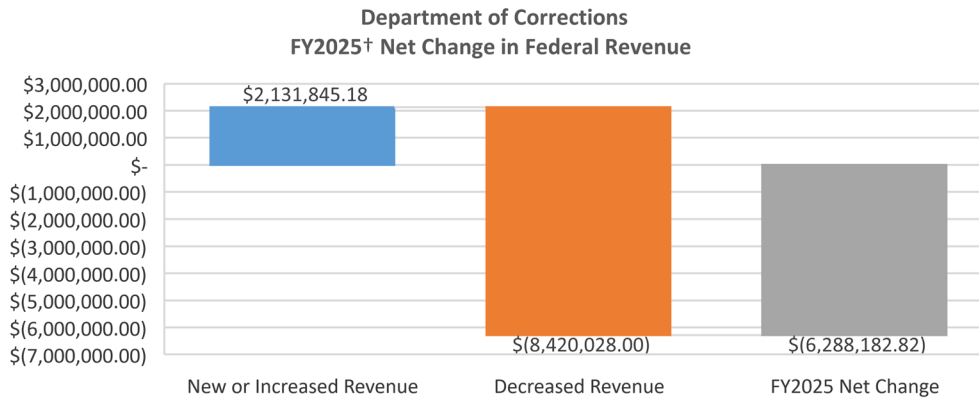
Figure 12: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Corrections, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

In FY2025, the Department of Corrections received a total of \$6,281,324.18 in federal funding. The agency received funding from 10 federal programs across 3 federal agencies. These funds supported 11 State of New Jersey programs, including 4 new initiatives. Figure 12 outlines the annual federal receipts recorded by the Department of Corrections from FY2020 through FY2025.

In FY2025, the Department of Corrections received \$2.13 million in new or increased federal receipts. These gains were offset by \$8.42 million in reduced receipts compared to FY2024, including reductions from programs for which fewer or no receipts were recorded during the fiscal year. After accounting for both increases and reductions relative to FY2024, the agency recorded a net year-over-year decrease of \$6.29 million, resulting in a negative net change of 50% for the fiscal year. Figure 13 illustrates the net change in federal receipts for FY2025.

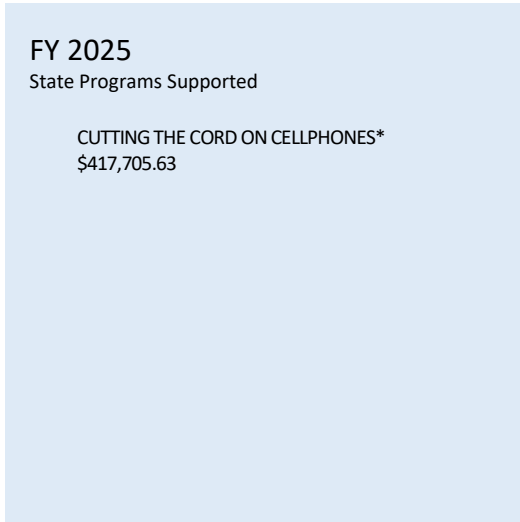

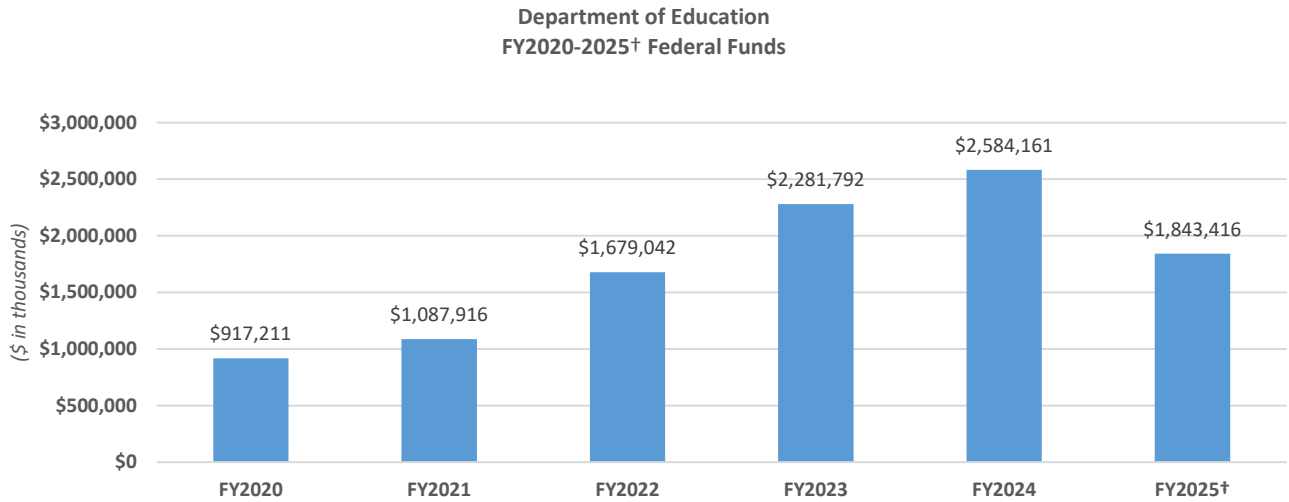

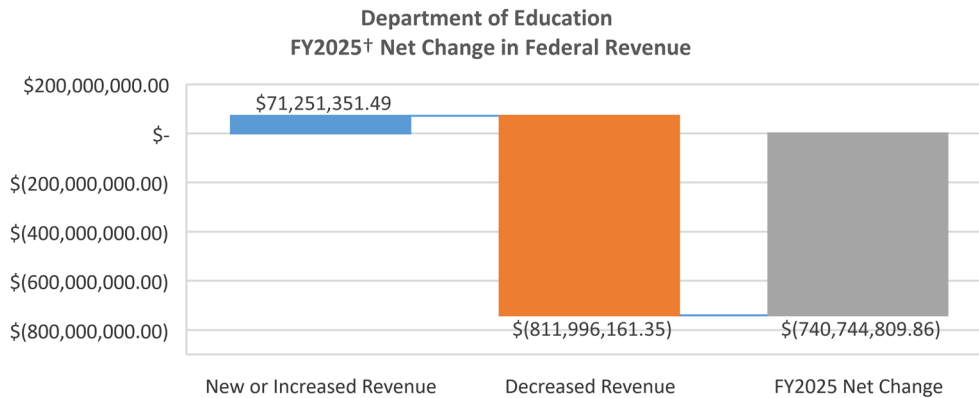
Figure 14: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Education, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

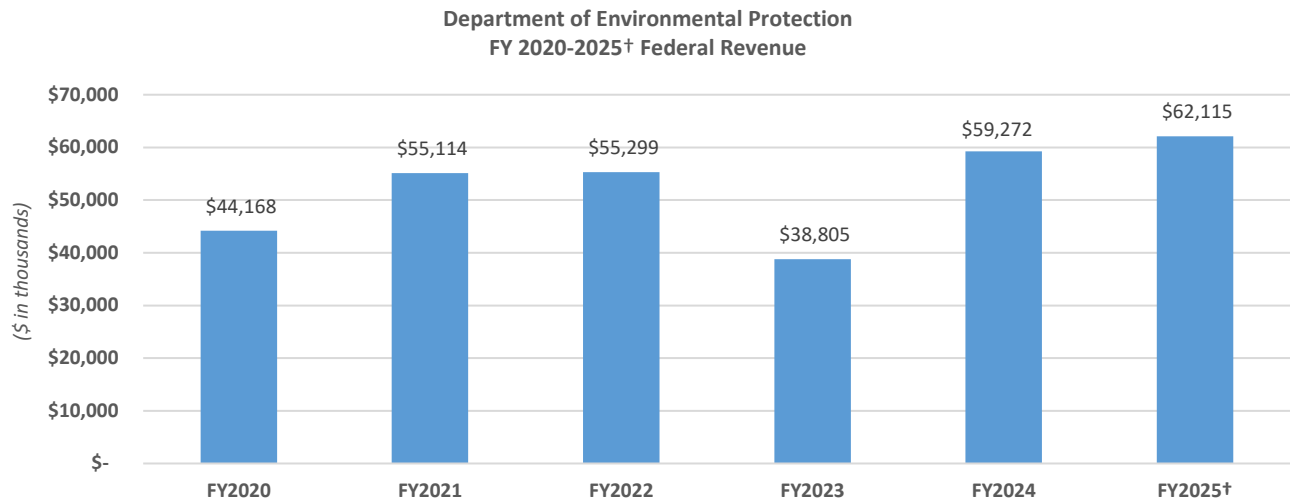

NJ DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

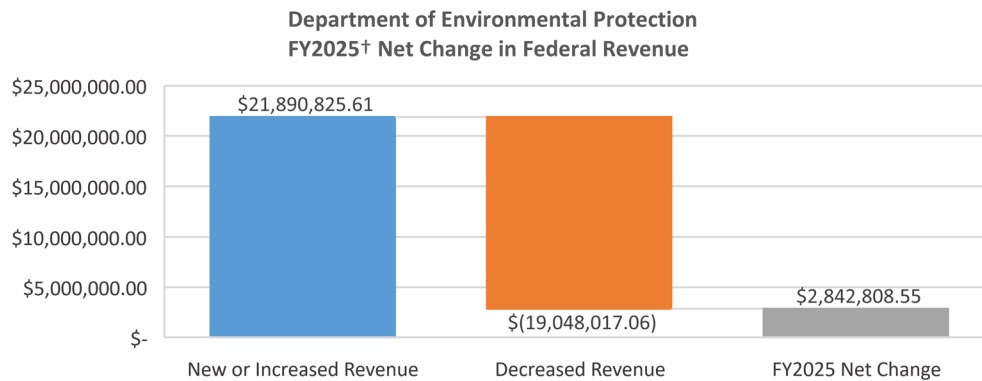
Figure 16: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Environmental Protection, FY2020 – FY2025+ (\$ in thousands)

In FY2025, the Department of Environmental Protection received a total of \$62,115,221.76 in federal funding. The agency received funding from 45 federal programs across 7 federal agencies. These funds supported 89 State of New Jersey programs, including 12 new initiatives. Figure 16 outlines the annual federal receipts recorded by the Department of Environmental Protection from FY2020 through FY2025.

In FY2025, the Department of Environmental Protection received \$21.89 million in new or increased federal receipts. These gains were offset by \$19.05 million in reduced receipts compared to FY2024, including reductions from programs for which fewer or no receipts were recorded during the fiscal year. After accounting for both increases and reductions relative to FY2024, the agency recorded a net year-over-year increase of \$2.84 million, resulting in a positive net change of 5% for the fiscal year. Figure 17 illustrates the net change in federal receipts for FY2025.

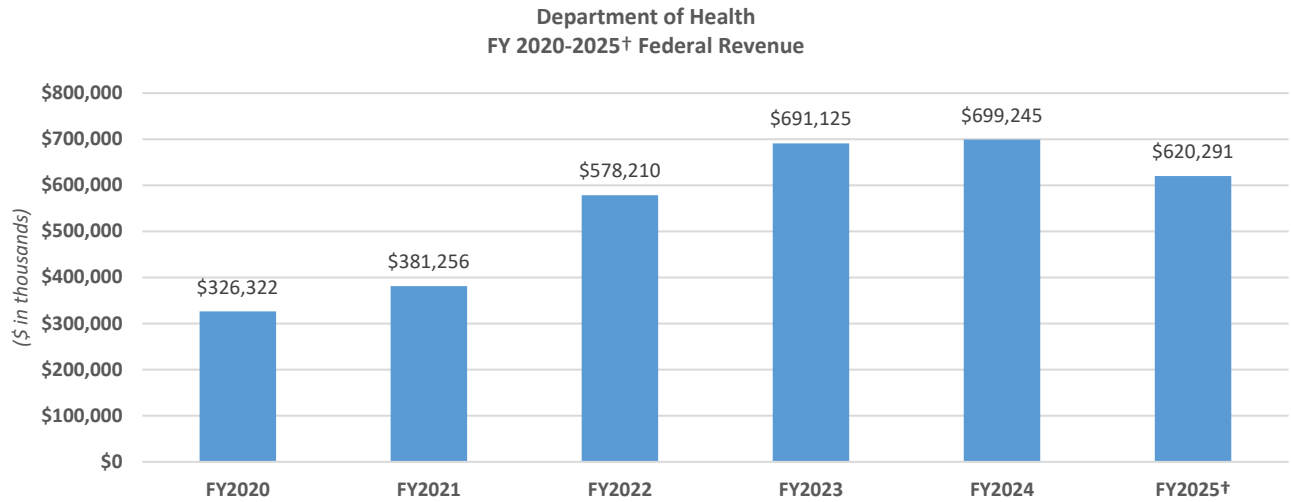

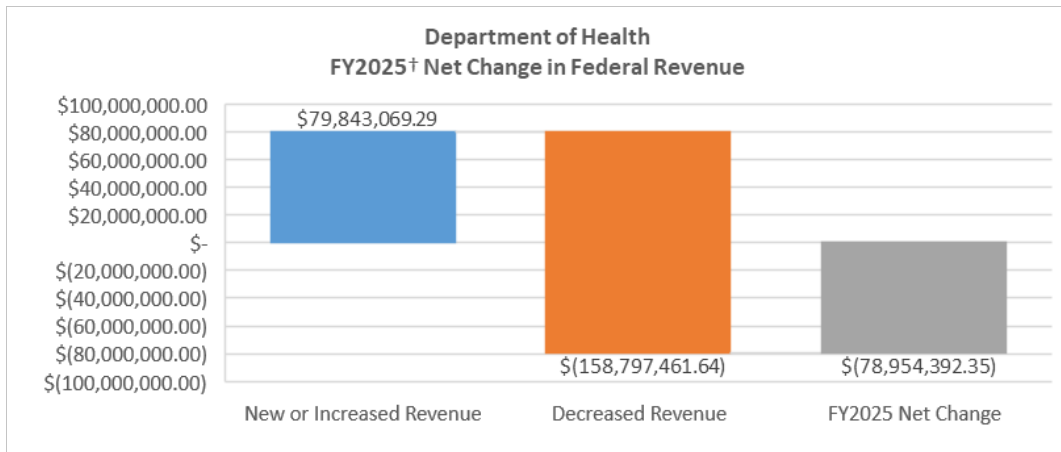
Figure 18: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Health, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

In FY2025, the Department of Health received a total of \$620,291,091.15 in federal funding. The agency received funding from 61 different federal programs, across 6 federal agencies. These funds supported 162 State of New Jersey programs, including 19 new initiatives. Figure 18 outlines the annual federal receipts recorded by the Department of Health from FY2020 through FY2025.

In FY2025, the Department of Health received \$79.84 million in new or increased federal receipts. These gains were offset by \$158.80 million in reduced receipts compared to FY2024, including reductions from programs for which fewer or no receipts were recorded during the fiscal year. After accounting for both increases and reductions relative to FY2024, the agency recorded a net year-over-year decrease of \$78.95 million, resulting in a negative net change of 11% for the fiscal year. Figure 19 illustrates the net change in federal receipts for FY2025.

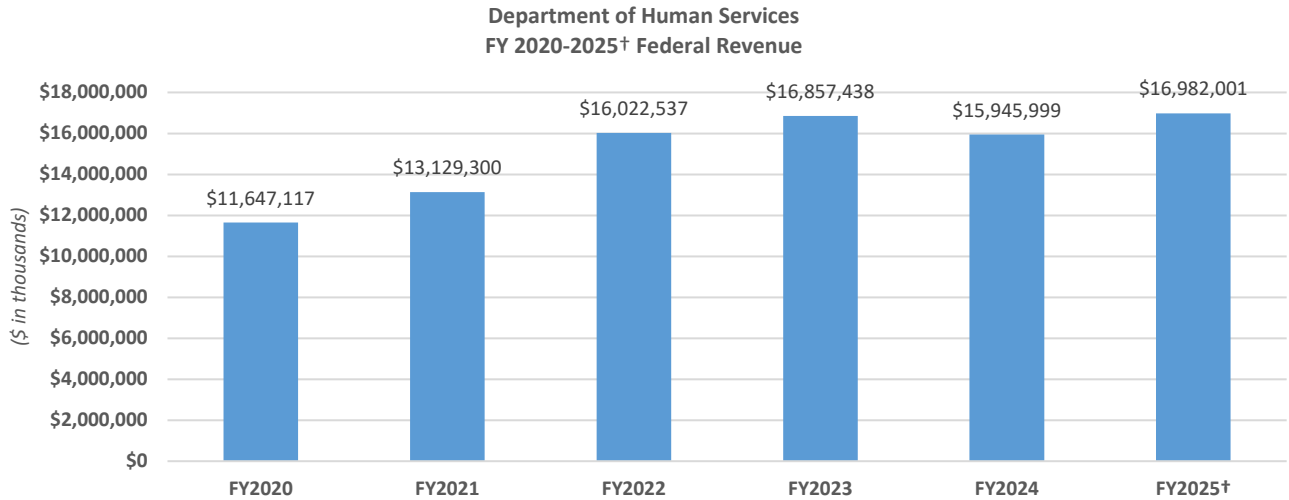

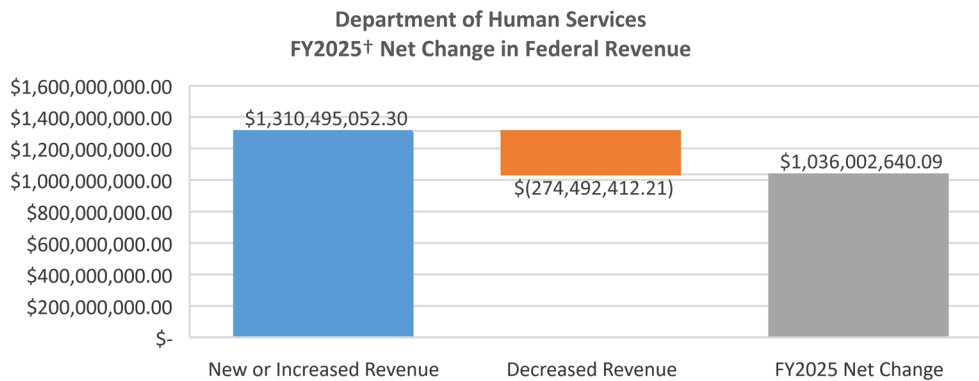
Figure 20: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Human Services, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

In FY2025, the Department of Human Services received a total of \$16,982,001,407.06 in federal funding. The agency received funding from 40 federal programs across 4 federal agencies. These funds supported 95 State of New Jersey programs, including 5 new initiatives. Figure 20 outlines the annual federal receipts recorded by the Department of Human Services from FY2020 through FY2025.

In FY2025, the Department of Human Services received \$1.31 billion in new or increased federal receipts. These gains were offset by \$274.49 million in reduced receipts compared to FY2024, including reductions from programs for which fewer or no receipts were recorded during the fiscal year. After accounting for both increases and reductions relative to FY2024, the agency recorded a net year-over-year increase of \$1.04 billion, resulting in a positive net change of 6% for the fiscal year. Figure 21 illustrates the net change in federal receipts for FY2025.

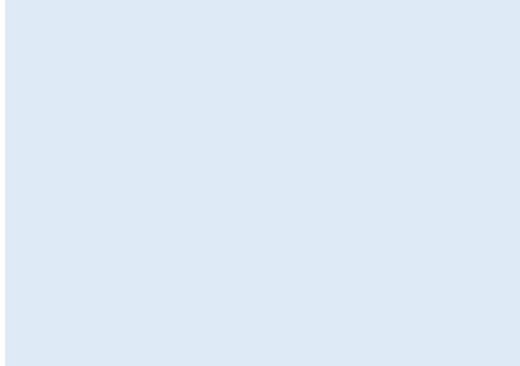

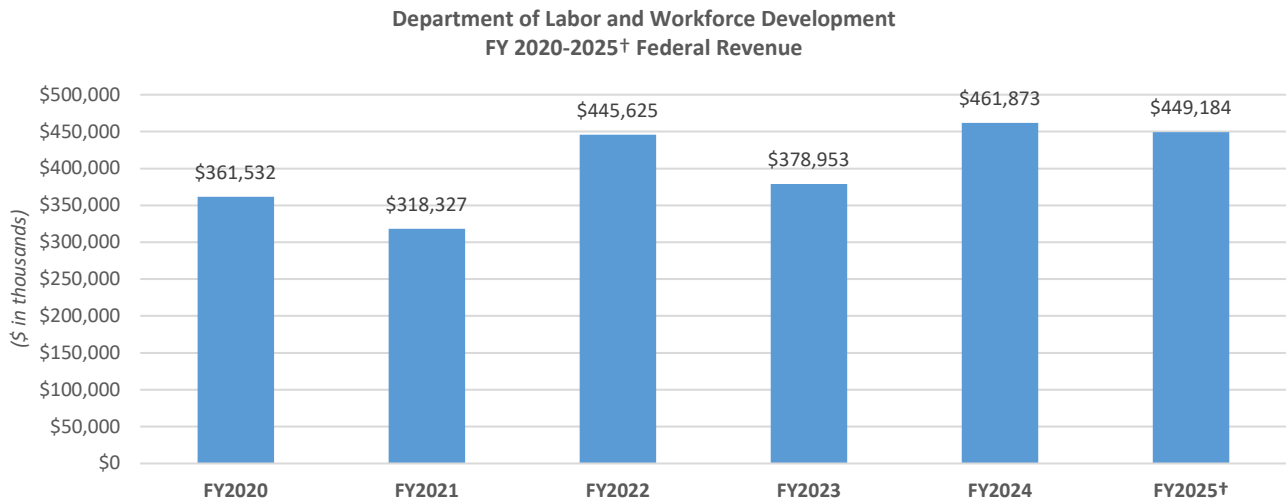

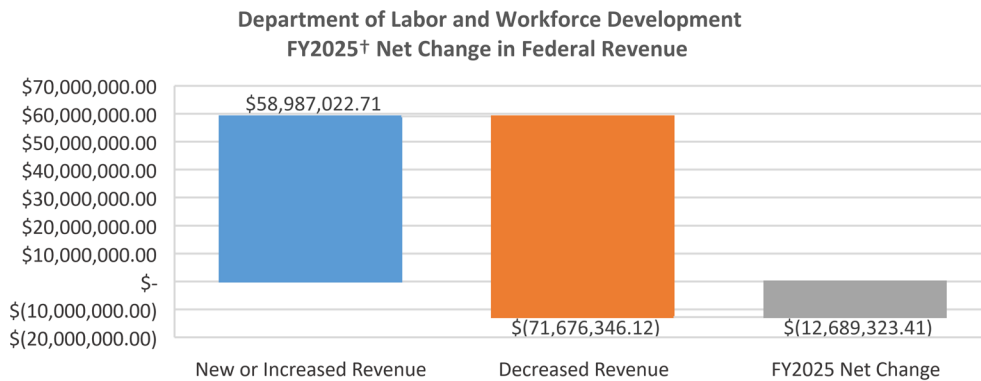
Figure 22: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Labor and Workforce Development, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

In FY2025, the Department of Labor and Workforce Development received a total of \$449,183,597.53 in federal funding. The agency received funding from 28 federal programs across 4 federal agencies. These funds supported 49 State of New Jersey programs, including 5 new initiatives. Figure 22 outlines the annual federal receipts recorded by the Department of Labor and Workforce Development from FY2020 through FY2025.

In FY2025, the Department of Labor and Workforce Development received \$58.99 million in new or increased federal receipts. These gains were offset by \$71.68 million in reduced receipts compared to FY2024, including reductions from programs for which fewer or no receipts were recorded during the fiscal year. After accounting for both increases and reductions relative to FY2024, the agency recorded a net year-over-year decrease of \$12.69 million, resulting in a negative net change of 3% for the fiscal year. Figure 23 illustrates the net change in federal receipts for FY2025.

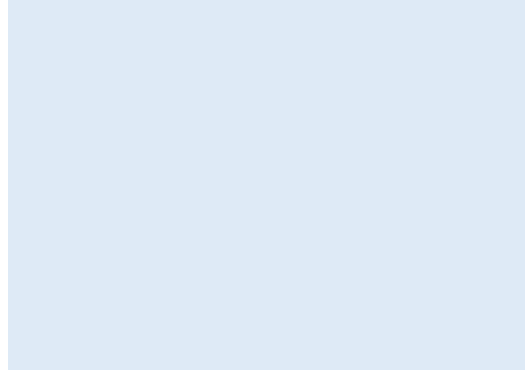

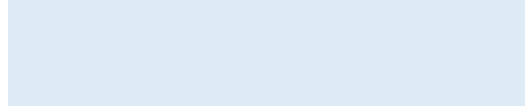

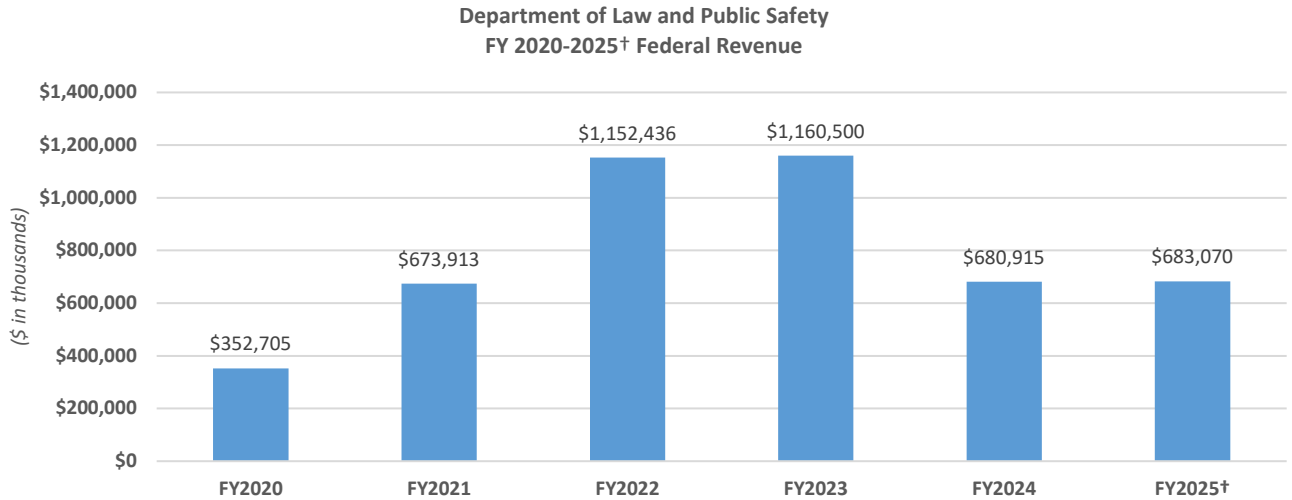

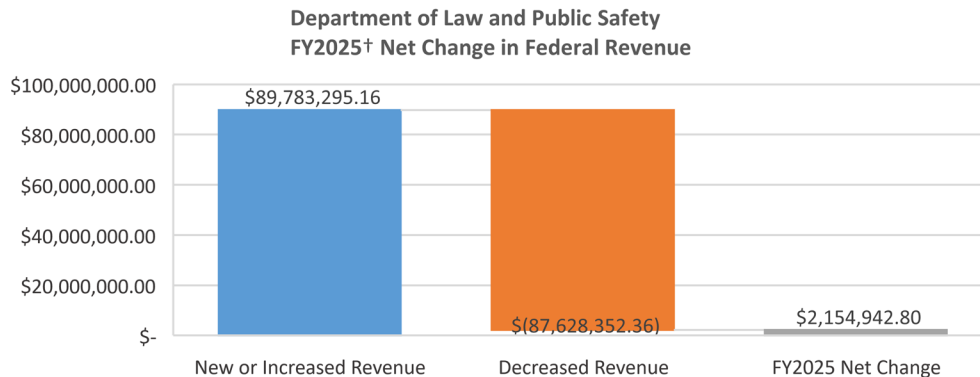
Figure 24: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Law and Public Safety, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

In FY2025, the Department of Law and Public Safety received a total of \$683,070,037.43 in federal funding. The agency received funding from 48 federal programs across 4 federal agencies. These funds supported 90 State of New Jersey programs, including 8 new initiatives. Figure 24 outlines the annual federal receipts recorded by the Department of Law and Public Safety from FY2020 through FY2025.

In FY2025, the Department of Law and Public Safety received \$89.78 million in new or increased federal receipts. These gains were offset by \$87.63 million in reduced receipts compared to FY2024, including reductions from programs for which fewer or no receipts were recorded during the fiscal year. After accounting for both increases and reductions relative to FY2024, the agency recorded a net year-over-year increase of \$2.15 million, resulting in a positive net change of 0.3% for the fiscal year. Figure 25 illustrates the net change in federal receipts for FY2025.

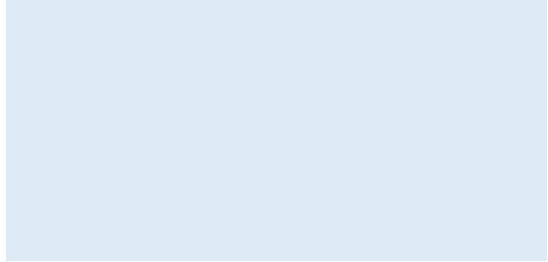

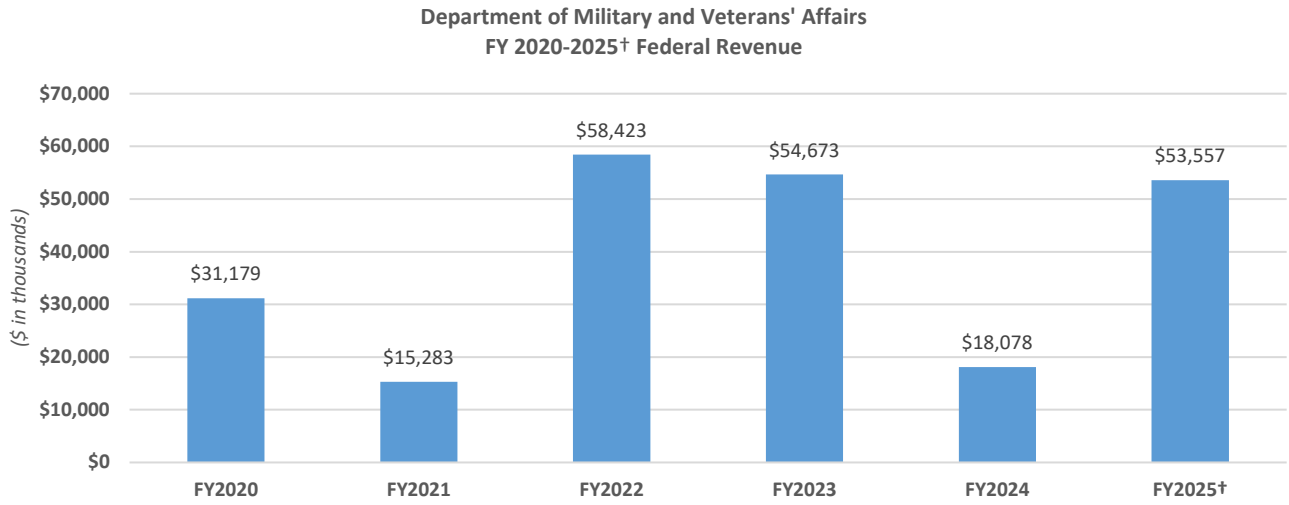

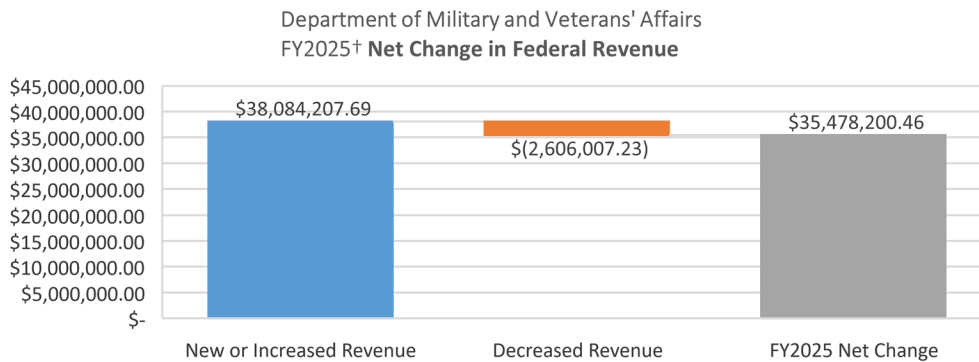
Figure 26: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

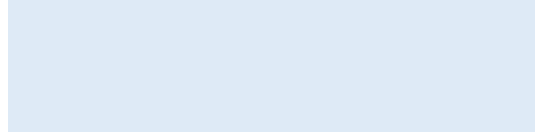

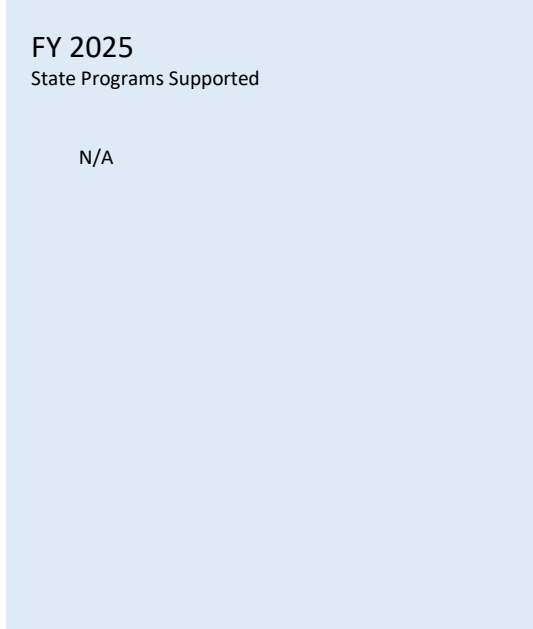

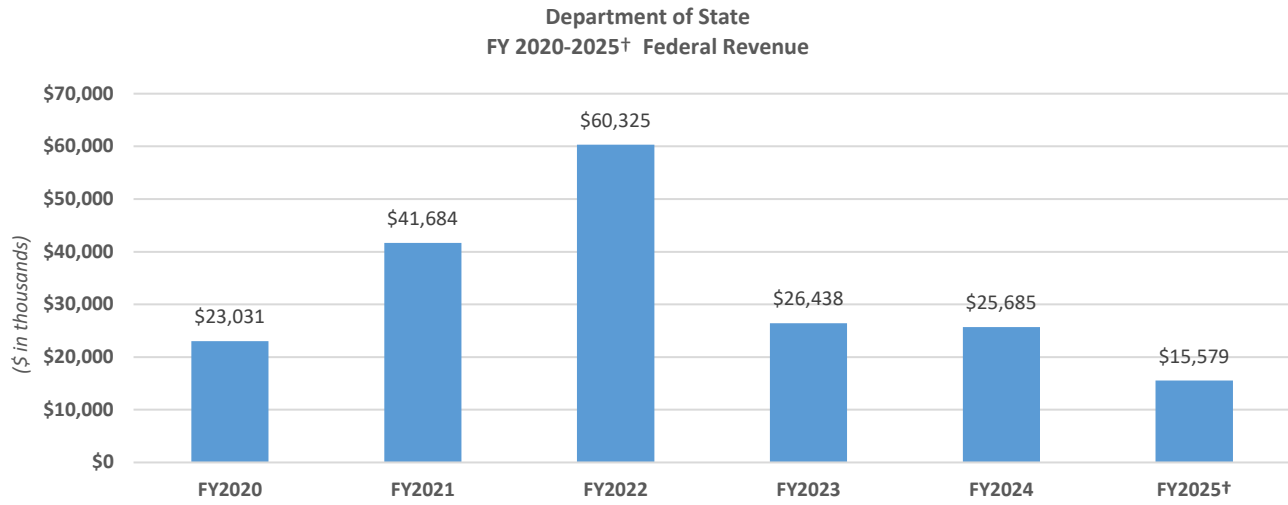

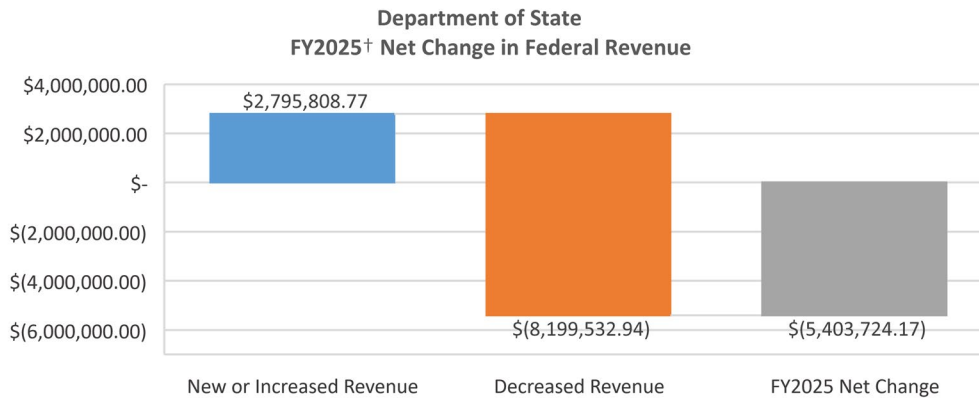
Figure 28: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of State, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

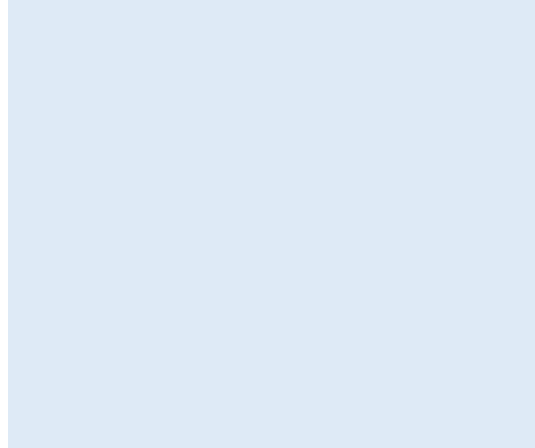

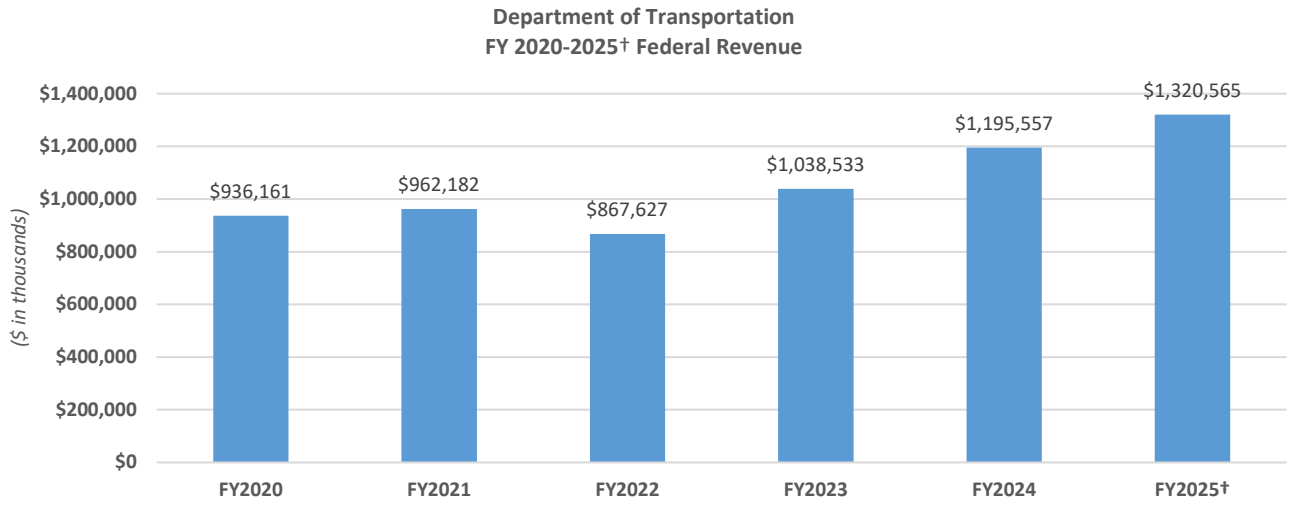

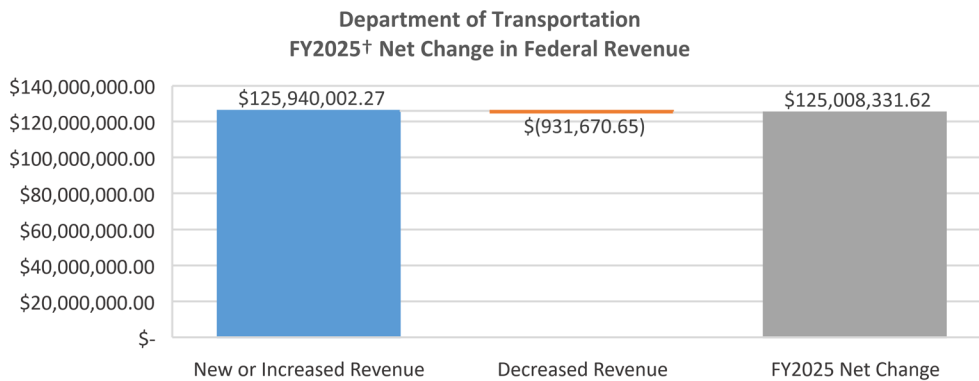
Figure 30: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of Transportation, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

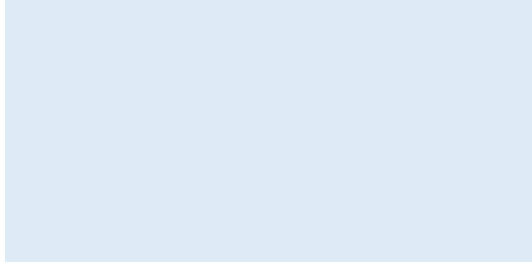

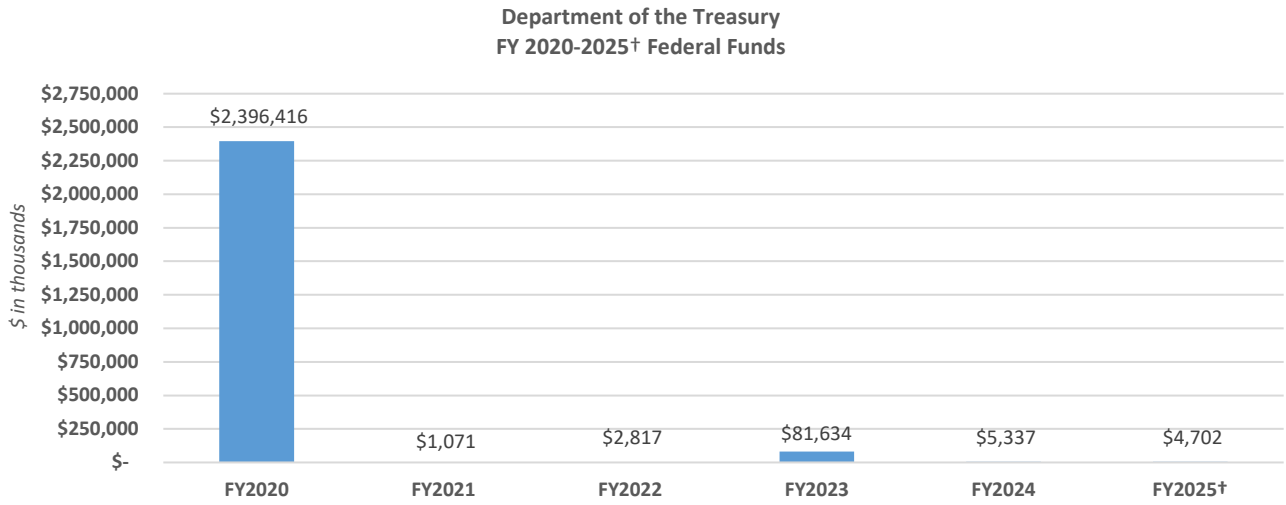

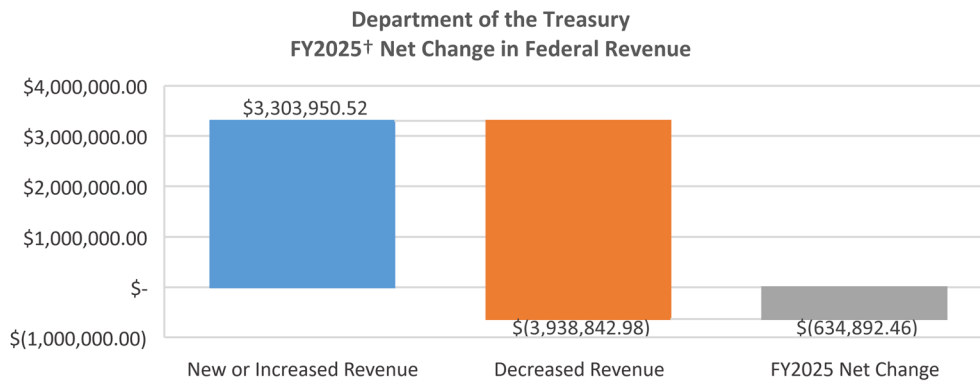
Figure 32: Federal Funds Received by NJ Department of the Treasury, FY2020 – FY2025† (\$ in thousands)

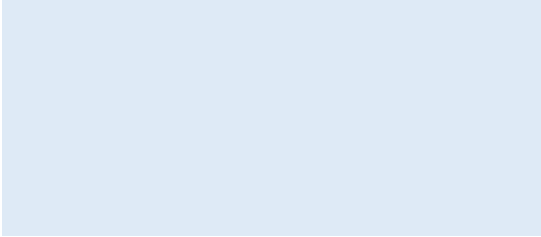

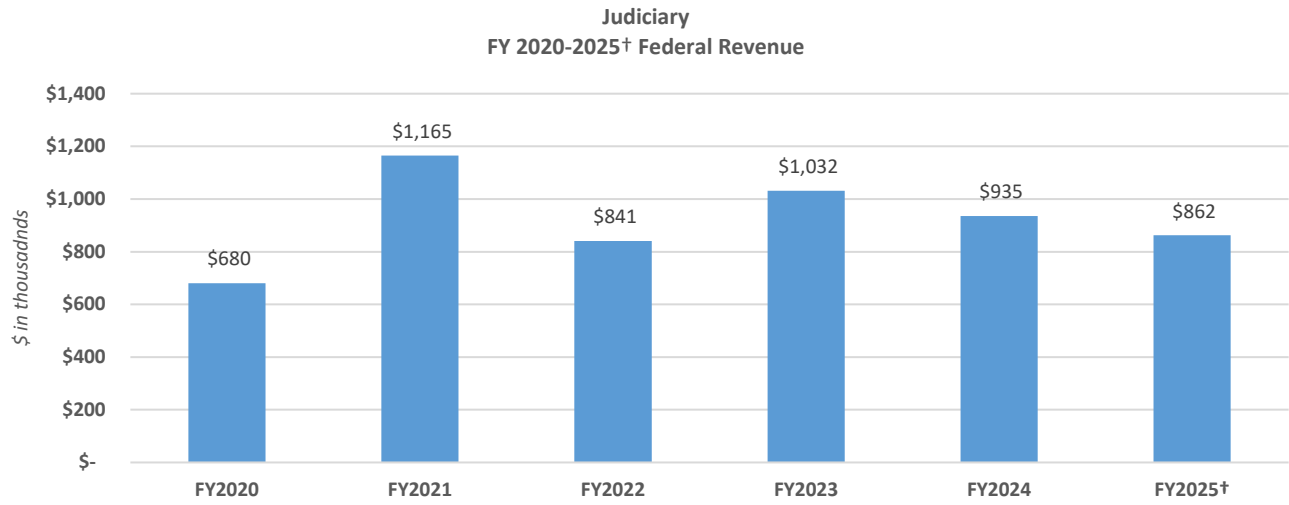

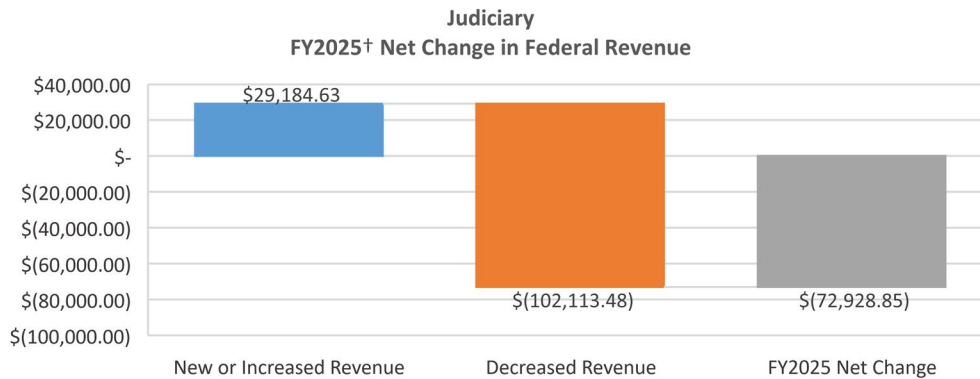
Figure 34: Federal Funds Received by the Judiciary, FY2020 – FY2025[†] (\$ in thousands)

In FY2025, the Judiciary received \$29 thousand in new or increased federal receipts. These gains were offset by \$102 thousand in reduced receipts compared to FY2024, including reductions from programs for which fewer or no receipts were recorded during the fiscal year. After accounting for both increases and reductions relative to FY2024, the agency recorded a net year-over-year decrease of \$73 thousand, resulting in a negative net change of 8% for the fiscal year. Figure 35 illustrates the net change in federal receipts for FY2025.

GLOSSARY

Assistance Listing

Formally known as Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA), the authoritative source of information about federal government programs that provide grants, loans, scholarships, insurance, and other types of assistance or benefits to the American public. Search assistance listings at SAM.gov to learn about these potential funding sources.

Assistance Listing Number (ALN)

A unique number, formally known as the CFDA Number, assigned to a program or activity within the Assistance Listings. The first two digits identify the federal agency that administers the assistance.

Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA)

The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) has been replaced by the Annual Publication of Assistance Listings. See Assistance Listings.

Cooperative Agreement

A legal instrument of financial assistance between a Federal awarding agency or pass-through entity and a non-Federal entity.

Cost Sharing or Matching

The portion of project costs not paid by Federal funds (unless otherwise authorized by Federal statute). See also §200.306 Cost sharing or matching of the OMB Uniform Grant Guidance.

Discretionary Grant

A grant (or cooperative agreement) for which the federal awarding agency generally may select the recipient from among all eligible recipients, may decide to make or not make an award based on the programmatic, technical, or scientific content of an application, and can decide the amount of funding to be awarded.

Earmark

Earmarks are grants that are appropriated by Congress prior to a peer review. The term "earmark" is a reference to the Congressional Record where the awards are written into legislation specifically with the grant applicant's name, activity, and dollar amounts.

Federal Account Identification

The 11-digit budget account identification code(s) that funds the assistance listing.

Federal Agency

An "agency" as defined at 5 U.S.C. 551(1) and further clarified by 5 U.S.C. 552(f). The term generally refers to the agency that provides a Federal award directly to a recipient unless the context indicates otherwise.

Federal Assistance

The federal government provides assistance to the American public in the form of projects, services, and activities. It supports a broad range of assistance listings—in various areas such as education, health care, research, and infrastructure.

Federal Awarding Agency

The Federal agency that provides a Federal award directly to a non-Federal entity.

Formula Grant

Allocations of federal funding to states, territories, or local units of government determined by distribution formulas in the authorizing legislation and regulations. To receive a formula grant, the entity must meet all the eligibility criteria for the program, which are pre-determined and not open to discretionary funding decisions. Formula grants typically fund activities of a continuing nature and may not be confined to a specific project. Common elements in formulas include population, proportion of population below the poverty line, and other demographic information.

Formula Matching Requirements

The statutory formula and/or administrative rule reference in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) to include the title, chapter, part, and subpart of the public law citation.

Grant Account Module

The Grant Accounting Module is a subsystem within NJCFS that supports the additional tracking and reporting requirements of federal and other types of grants. The Grant Accounting Module provides a structure for budgetary control independent of appropriations, and an automated mechanism for recording direct and indirect grant costs and associated revenues.

Maintenance of Effort (MOE) Requirement

Stipulates that the State or locality receiving a grant must maintain or contribute a certain level of financial effort in a specified area to receive federal assistance.

Mandatory Grant

A grant (or cooperative agreement) awarded under a program where the authorizing statute requires the head of the agency or designee to make an award to each eligible entity under the conditions and in the amount (or based on the formula) specified in the statute.

Matching or Cost Sharing

The portion of project costs not paid by federal funds (unless otherwise authorized by federal statute). Matching funds are restricted to the same use of funds as allowed for the federal funds. If it is not allowable under the federal award, it is not allowable as match.

New Jersey Comprehensive Financial System (NJCFIS) –

New Jersey Comprehensive Financial System is the central accounting system for the state.

New or First Time

A program that receipted funding for the first time in the current fiscal year. A program is considered ‘new’ or ‘first-time’ if it did not provide federal receipts to the same agency at any point during the previous five fiscal years. In some cases, these programs may be newly established at the federal level or may be new only to the agency or State.

Pass-Through Entity

Pass-through entity means a non-Federal entity that provides a subaward to a subrecipient to carry out part of a Federal program.

Pass-Through Funding

Funds issued by a federal agency to a state agency or institution that are then transferred to other state agencies, units of local government, or other eligible groups per the award eligibility terms. The state agency or institution is referred to as the "prime recipient" of the pass-through funds. The secondary recipients are referred to as "subrecipients." The prime recipient issues the subawards as competitive or noncompetitive as dictated by the prime award terms and authorizing legislation.

Receipt

For purposes of this report, a “receipt” refers to federal funds that have been reimbursed to or deposited into the New Jersey Comprehensive Financial System during the fiscal year. Receipts represent actual cash received by the State and recorded in the accounting system, and does not reflect federal awards amounts, total grant authorizations, or funds that have been obligated but not yet drawn down.

Subaward

An award provided by a pass-through entity to a subrecipient for the subrecipient to carry out part of a Federal award received by the pass-through entity.

Subrecipient

A non-Federal entity that receives a subaward from a pass-through entity to carry out part of a Federal program; but does not include an individual that is a beneficiary of such program. A subrecipient may also be a recipient of other Federal awards directly from a Federal awarding agency.

Types of Assistance

The form in which the federal government provides assistance to the award recipient.

Use of Assistance

The purpose for which a recipient entity is permitted to expend funds awarded under a specific assistance listing.
