Military and Veteran Benefits

We offer a range of essential tax benefits, including property tax relief, Income Tax exemptions and credits, and other financial relief programs designed to honor military service and support financial well-being.





INCOME TAX

EXCLUSIONS:

Combat pay and income from a military pension are tax-free in New Jersey and should not be reported on your New Jersey Income Tax return.

EXEMPTION:

Eligible veterans who were honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances from active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces can claim a \$6,000 exemption on their New Jersey Income Tax return.

CREDITS:

Wounded Warrior Caregivers Credit offers a tax credit to qualified family caregivers of military service members with a disability resulting from service in any war or conflict on or after September 11, 2001.

Gold Star Family Counseling Credit offers a credit to mental health care professionals who provided counseling through the Gold Star Family Counseling program.



SALES TAX

MILITARY SALES TAX DEFERMENT:

If you are a New Jersey resident service member stationed outside New Jersey, you may be able to buy a vehicle, title it in New Jersey, and wait to pay the Sales Tax until you bring the car home.

DISABLED VETERANS CAR PROGRAM:

If you are a disabled veteran and you received money from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) or the New Jersey Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (NJDMVA) to buy a car, you do not have to pay Sales Tax on the amount you received for the vehicle.

PROPERTY TAX

The following programs are overseen by your municipal tax assessor. Check with your local office to learn more about eligibility and how to apply.

ACTIVE MILITARY SERVICE PROPERTY TAX DEFERMENT:

If you are deployed or called up for active duty during wartime, you may be able to defer your property tax payments.

\$250 VETERANS' PROPERTY TAX DEDUCTION:

If you are an honorably discharged veteran who served on active duty, you could be eligible for a \$250 property tax deduction each year.

100% DISABLED VETERAN PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION:

If you are an honorably discharged veteran who became 100% permanently and totally disabled while on active duty, you could qualify for a yearly property tax exemption on your main home.
