PROPERTY TAX

These programs are managed by your local tax office and are designed to provide financial relief and support for those who serve and have served. Check with your local tax assessor's office to learn more about eligibility and how to apply.

ACTIVE MILITARY SERVICE PROPERTY TAX DEFERMENT

If you are deployed or called up for active duty during wartime, you may be able to defer your property tax payments. Someone else can even file for you if you are unable to apply.

Once your deployment ends, you will have 90 days to pay the deferred taxes. This deferment does not cover taxes already overdue before you were deployed. Those late payments will continue to accrue interest from the original due date.

If you have a mortgage with an escrow account for your property taxes, contact your lender to discuss how the deferment might affect your payments.

Sewer, water, electric, and other municipal charges are not included and must be paid on time.



\$250 VETERANS' PROPERTY TAX DEDUCTION

If you are an honorably discharged veteran who served on active duty, you could be eligible for a \$250 property tax deduction each year.

If you served in the Reserves or National Guard, you must have been called to active duty (not just training) to qualify.

This deduction is also available to surviving spouses, civil union partners, or domestic partners of honorably discharged veterans with active duty service as long as they do not remarry, enter into another civil union, or domestic partnership.

100% DISABLED VETERAN PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION

If you are an honorably discharged veteran who became 100% permanently and totally disabled while on active duty, you could qualify for a yearly property tax exemption on your main home.

This benefit might also be available if you are the surviving spouse, civil union partner, or domestic partner of a veteran who met those same service and disability requirements.
