In order to provide the department with the flexibility to administer appropriations of federal funds, the commissioner may use moneys from the federal programs identified hereinabove as Interstate Program, Demonstration Program, Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Program, National Highway System, Surface Transportation Program, Bridge Program, Minimum Guarantee, Ferry Program, Recreational Trails, National Boating Infrastructure Grant Program, and Metropolitan Planning Funds to finance the cost of the construction, design, right—of—way, planning, and project development phases of work of any project listed under any federal program pursuant to the following transfer provisions. The Commissioner of Transportation may transfer federal funds among projects having the same phase of work, subject to the approval of the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting. The commissioner shall apply to the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting for permission to transfer federal funds among projects having different phases of work. If the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting shall consent thereto, the request to transfer federal funds among projects having different phases of work shall be transmitted to the Legislative Budget and Finance Officer for approval or disapproval and returned to the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting. The Joint Budget Oversight Committee or its successor shall be empowered to review all transfers submitted to the Legislative Budget and Finance Officer to approve or disapprove any transfer.

Notwithstanding any State law to the contrary, no State agency shall accept or expend federal funds except as appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise provided in this act.

In addition to the federal funds appropriated in this act, there are appropriated the following federal funds, subject to the approval of the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting: emergency disaster aid funds; pass—through grants to political subdivisions of the State over which the State is not permitted to exercise discretion in the use or distribution of the funds and for which no State matching funds are required; the first 25% of unanticipated grant awards, and up to 25% of increases in previously anticipated grant awards for which no State matching funds are required except, for the purpose of this section, federal funds received by one executive agency that are ultimately expended by another executive agency shall not be considered pass—through grants; federal financial aid funds for students attending post—secondary educational institutions in excess of the amount specifically appropriated, and any such grants intended to prevent threats to homeland security up to 100% of previously anticipated or unanticipated grant award amounts for which no State matching funds are required, provided however, that the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting shall notify the Legislative Budget and Finance Officer of such grants; and all other grants of \$500,000 or less which have been awarded competitively.

For the purposes of federal funds appropriations, "political subdivisions of the State" means counties, municipalities, school districts, or agencies thereof, regional, county or municipal authorities, or districts other than interstate authorities or districts; "discretion" refers to any action in which an agency may determine either the amount of funds to be allocated or the recipient of the allocation; and "grants" refers to one–time, or time limited awards, which are received pursuant to submission of a grant application in competition with other grant applications.

The unexpended balances of federal funds as of June 30, 2004 are continued for the same purposes. The Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting shall inform the Legislative Budget and Finance Officer by November 1, 2004 of any unexpended balances which are continued.

The appropriate executive agencies shall prepare and submit to the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee and the Assembly Appropriations Committee, or their successors, by March 1, 2005, reports on proposed expenditures during fiscal year 2005 for the following federal programs: the alcohol, drug abuse and mental health block grant; the education block grant; the community services block grant; the jobs training partnership block grant; the low income energy assistance block grant; the maternal and child health block grant; the preventive health and health services block grant; the small cities block grant; the social services block grant; and the child care block grant. These reports shall account for all federal, State and local funds which are anticipated to be expended on block grant programs, shall provide an accounting of block grant expenditures during the prior fiscal year, and shall provide a detailed list of contracts awarded to provide services under the block grants.

Out of the appropriations herein, the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting is empowered to approve payments to liquidate any unrecorded liabilities for materials delivered or services rendered in prior fiscal years, upon the written recommendations of any department head or the department head's designated representative. The Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting shall reject any recommendations for payment which the Director deems improper.

The sum herein appropriated to the Department of Transportation for the Hudson–Bergen Light Rail Transit System is hereby appropriated, to the extent necessary, to pay the principal of and interest on the grant anticipation notes issued by the New Jersey Transit Corporation.

In order to permit flexibility in the handling of appropriations and ensure the timely payment of claims to providers of medical services, amounts may be transferred to and from the various items of appropriation within the General Medical Services program classification, and within the federal matching funding, in the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services in the Department of Human Services, and within the Medical Services for the Aged program classification, and within the federal matching funding, in the Division of Senior Services in the Department of Health and Senior Services, subject to the approval of the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting. Notice thereof shall be provided to the Legislative Budget and Finance Officer on the effective date of the approved transfer.

Notwithstanding the provisions of any law, regulation or Executive Order to the contrary, any purchase by the State or by a State agency or local government unit of equipment, goods or services related to homeland security and domestic preparedness, that is paid for or reimbursed by federal funds awarded by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security or other federal agency, appropriated in this fiscal year, may be made through the receipt of public bids or as an alternative to public bidding and subject to the provisions of this paragraph, through direct purchase without advertising for bids or rejecting bids already received but not awarded. The equipment, goods or services purchased by a local government unit shall be referred to in the grant agreement issued by the State administrative agency administering such funds and shall be authorized by resolution of the governing body of the local government unit entering into the grant agreement. Such resolution may, without subsequent action of the local governing body, simultaneously accept the grant from the State administrative agency, authorize the insertion of the revenue and offsetting appropriation in the budget of the local government unit, and authorize the contracting agent of the local government unit to procure the equipment, goods or services. A copy of such resolution shall be filed with the chief financial officer of the local government unit, the State Administrative agency and the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs. Purchases made without public bidding shall be from vendors that shall either (1) be holders of a current State contract for the equipment, goods or services sought, or (2) be participating in a federal procurement program established by a federal department or agency, or (3) have been approved by the State Treasurer in consultation with the New Jersey Domestic Security Preparedness Task Force. All homeland security purchases herein shall continue to be subject to all grant requirements and conditions approved by the State administrative agency. The Director of the Division of Purchase and Property may enter into or participate in purchasing agreements with one or more other states, or political subdivisions or compact agencies thereof, for the purchase of such equipment, goods or services, using monies appropriated under this act, to meet the domestic preparedness and homeland security needs of this State. Such purchasing agreement may provide for the sharing of costs and the methods of payments relating to such purchases.
