

The criteria used is from the US Census Bureau's 2019 Tract Level Planning Data Base. The Planning Database (PDB) contains select American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year estimates, ACS response rates, and the Census Bureau's low response score (LRS), where the LRS is a tract-level predicted value of self-response. Tracts considered Hard to Count for the purposes of this grant were those tracts that had a high LRS score which indicates probability of low self-response. The top 50% of New Jersey tracts and their population totals, based on the LRS, were selected as the Hard to Count tracts within each County and Municipality.
